

Girls said- they are locked in bathrooms and beaten up




Jabalpur: A sensational case has emerged from the girl's reform home in Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh. The girls residing in the reform home have made serious allegations against the in-charge, Anshuman Shukla, claiming instances of molestation, inappropriate touching, and physical abuse. The victims report being served poor-quality food, and those who protest are allegedly locked in bathrooms and subjected to beatings. Furthermore, there are accusations that money allocated to the girls is being misappropriated under

Fertilizer shortage plagues farmers

Leads to midnight queues in Mandla



Mandla: A severe fertilizer shortage has brought immense hardship to farmers in the Mandla district, forcing them to queue up in the middle of the night for a chance to get supplies. dire, with farmers—including women and children-lining up as

early as 2 AM, enduring hours of waiting without food or water. The conditions at the warehouse are deplorable. The access road is a muddy mess, making it difficult for both ve-Inadequate supply and lack of ac**countability:** The demand for fertilizer is overwhelming, with up to a thousand farmers arriving daily. However, only 120 tokens are being distributed, leaving the vast majority to return home empty-handed after waiting all day. This chaos is worsened by a complete lack of official oversight. No responsible government officer has been present at the site to manage the situation. Instead an unsigned and unsealed notice is simply posted on a wall, offering no real solutions. Farmers are furious accusing the government and adminpromises of timely fertilizer availability. They warn that the ongoing crisis could severely impact their crops. In a desperate plea, the farmers have announced that if the shortage and mismanagement are not resolved promptly, they will be forced to

Suspected food poisoning strikes tribal hostel

Dozens of girls hospitalized in Ratlam



Ratlam: A tribal girls' hostel in Bajna is under scrutiny after 35 students fell severely ill with symptoms of viral fever and vomiting, leading to a suspected food poisoning scare. The incident has exposed alleged negligence and overcrowding, sparking public out-

Initial reports state the girls were taken to a local health center but were reportedly discharged and sent

back to the hostel after receiving basic treatment. However, as their condition worsened, local leaders and district administration intervened, getting the students re-admitted for proper medical care.

Overcrowding and lack of accountability: The incident has brought the tribal affairs department into question. Sources reveal the hostel was housing approximately 170 students in just four rooms. While some officials have claimed the illness was caused by students bathing in cold water during the rainy season, District Panchayat member Sharad Dodiyar in-

sists food poisoning is the likely cause.

Dodiyar, who helped the affected girls overnight, stated, "Thirty-five girls fell ill at once. It's highly likely to be a case of food poisoning."

Adding to the controversy, officials, including the

Tribal Affairs Assistant Commissioner, have reportedly avoided commenting. A local Block Medical Officer initially downplayed the incident, attributing it to seasonal illnesses and minimizing the number of affected girls. Authorities at the connected school reportedly locked the gates and switched off their phones, prompting senior officials to order police to break the lock and initiate an investigation. Sailana SDM Manish Iain was also at the scene to question the principal.

Campaign to remove illegal constructions near transmission lines

MP Transco issues notices



Barwani: Madhya Pradesh Power Transmission Company (MP Transco) has started a campaign to remove unsafe and illegal constructions made by ignoring electrical safety standards near extra high tension transmission lines in Barwani city. These constructions made within the restricted corridor limit of 27 meters pose a serious threat to human life and there is a possibility of accidents. Notices have been is-

sued to 24 persons to remove illegal constructions in these areas. MP Transco Barwani Engineer Veer Singh Bhuria said that in the first phase of the campaign, people were given advice, now the concerned have been asked to remove the constructions by issuing notice. Employees are appealing to maintain the prescribed safe distance from the high tension line through the public address system and people are being alerted about the possible dangers.

Why is a safe corridor of 27 meters necessary?

According to the guidelines of the Central Electricity Authority, no construction should be done in the minimum safe distance of the 27 meter corridor of transmission lines of 132 kV capacity. This distance has been fixed because the conductor (electric wire) can swing due to air pressure. Keeping this swing in mind, this standard has been set to prevent accidents. Illegal constructions made under transmission lines can prove to be 600 times more dangerous than domestic electricity. This not only poses a risk of longterm power supply disruption in the district, but also poses a major threat to the lives of common citizens.

Team of agriculture experts takes stock of crop damage

Vidisha: When complaints about Kharif crops being damaged due to chemical pesticides following untimely rains in Vidisha district reached Union Agriculture Minister Shiyrai Singh Chauban, he ordered Shivraj Singh Chauhan, he ordered investigation. During his recent visit to the area, he inspected the affected fields and reassured farmers that strict measures would be implemented against companies selling counterfeit pesticides. He also promised to dispatch central scientific teams to investigate the causes of the crop damage. In response to the Minister's directives, a team of seven agricultural scientists from both central and state levels visited the villages of Chhirkheda and Semra on Monday to assess the extent of

the damage. Vidisha MLA Shri Mukesh Tandon emphasized the importance of visiting every affected farmer's field and documenting the actual conditions in their reports. He guided the scientists to the fields of local farmers Shri Bhagwan Singh and Shri Udham Singh in Chandkheda to evaluate the damage to their soybean crops. The scientific team included notable experts such as Dr. SRK Singh, Director of Atari ICAR Zone 9 Jabalpur, and several other agricultural scientists from various institutions. They were accompanied by KS Kapadia, Deputy Director of the Department of Farmer Welfare and Agriculture Development, along with other departmental and block-level officers.
