Protesters handed a memo to a dog

Chhindwara: Thousands of farmers converged on Jail Baghicha ground for a historic "Save the Farmer" rally, where former MP Nakul Nath launched a scathing attack on the BJP government, vowing to fight for the rights of farmers, tribals, and youth.

✔ Broken Promises: He criticized the government for failing to deliver on its promises, such as providing Rs 3,000 to "Ladli Bahnas" and Rs 450 gas cylinder.

Other prominent Congress lead ers echoed Nakul Nath's message President Jitu Patwar claimed, "The farmer is weeping in the field, and the Chief Minister is sleeping in Bhopal." Leader of the Opposition Umang Singhar accused the BJP of stealing 1.6 million votes. Former minister Vijaylaksh mi Sadho said while Rajiv Gandhi gave a vision for the 21st century the BJP has made the state number one in crime and atrocities.

The rally concluded with a strong message of solidarity and a promise of continued protest against the government's policies.

Allegations of "Vote Theft" rock Madhya Pradesh

Congress cites "pre-determined" results **Ujjain:** The issue of "vote theft" has

reignited political tensions in Madhya Pradesh, with Congress leaders raising serious questions about the integrity of the state's electoral process. Former MLA Dilip Gurjar has accused the BJP of manipulating voter lists and having access to election results before they were officially declared.

The pre-determined outcome

Guriar, who represented the Nagda-Khachrod constituency, claimed that a staggering 36,000 voters were added to the electoral roll in his region in 2013, coinciding with Narendra Modi's rise to a national leadership role. He alleges that in the 2023 assembly elections, a BJP leader posted the exact re-



ficial announcement. The post correctly predicted that BJP candidate Tejbahadur Singh would get 93,000 votes and Gurjar would receive 77,000. The official results, a mere four days later, were nearly identical, with only a minor difference.

Calls for action

Gurjar, whose claims were first highlighted by Congress leader Digvijaya Singh on social media, has questioned the very purpose of the vote counting process if the re sults were already known. He also raised concerns about irregularities in voter lists from 2013 and 2018.

Despite repeated complaints to the Election Commission, Gurjar says no action was taken. He is now escalating the matter to Rahul Gandhi, who recently gave a 22page presentation on electoral ir regularities, alleging a "nationwide organized model of vote theft.'

The accusations have fueled a new political firestorm in the state, with the opposition demanding ac countability from the electoral

Congress MLA Arif Masood booked in **Kohefiza Police Station**

High Court directs to register FIR in college fraud case

Bhopal: In a major development, the Madhya Pradesh High Court has ordered an FIŘ to be registered against Congress MLA Arif Masood for allegedly using forged documents to obtain recognition for a college. The move intensifies the legal troubles for the legislator from Bhopal.

The case, registered at the Kohefiza police station, revolves around the Indira Priyadarshini College, run by a society of which Masood is the secretary. The Higher Education Department had previously canceled the college's recognition, citing a failure to submit required documents and meet necessary condi-

Masood had challenged the derecognition in the High Court. However, the court's scrutiny of the case revealed a different story. The bench, in a sharp observation, stated that a college could not have been run for so many years with fraudulent documents without "political patron-



While the High Court allowed the college to continue functioning for now to protect the students' interests, it has imposed a complete ban on new admissions. The court has also ordered the formation of a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to oversee the probe, underscoring the gravity of the allegations. The investigation will also look into the role of officials from the Higher Education Department who may have been complicit in the matter.

Given the seriousness of the matter, everyone's eyes are now fixed on what action is taken next in this

court emphasized that removing unproductive workers would send a strong message and lead to a sig-nificant improvement in the city's Swift action and future plans

In response to the judicial direc-

tive, Municipal Commissioner Sangh Priya stated that action is already underway. Over the past two months, the corporation has terminated the services of more than 20 sanitation workers for negligence. The commissioner further added that the corporation is implementing continuous monitoring and will hold meetings with ward officers and councilors to strategize on improving the city's sanitation system. The court's ruling underscores the urgent need for systemic reform to elevate Gwalior's cleanliness standards to match its aspirations.

Heavy monsoon rains bring relief in MP

Bhopal: The monsoon remained active across Madhya Pradesh over the last 24 hours, bringing significant rainfall to several regions and causing temperatures to fluctuate. While many parts of the state received much-needed downpours, the weather has been unpre-

Heavy rainfall was reported in most districts of the Bhopal, Indore, Narmadapuram, and Ujjain divisions, while the Jabalpur division received moderate rain. Lighter showers were recorded in the Rewa, Gwalior, Shahdol, and Sagar divisions, while the rest of the state remained mostly dry.

Temperature swings and forecast

Temperatures across the state

have been varied. The Rewa and Shahdol divisions saw a slight dip in maximum temperatures, but other parts of the state remained hot. Maximum temperatures in the Gwalior, Rewa, Jabalpur, Shahdol, and Sagar divisions were recorded at 1.6 to 3.0 degrees Celsius above normal, while in Bhopal, Narmadapuram and Ujjain, they were even higher, at 3.2 to 4.6 degrees Celsius above the average.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a forecast for the coming days, warning of moderate to heavy rainfall in the Bhopal, Indore, Jabalpur, Ujjain, and Narmadapuram divisions. Residents and farmers in these regions have been advised to remain cautious and prepared for the upcoming rains.

According to the complaint, the two officials were demanding a 5% cut from the final bill of Rs 2,47,000 to process

dentified as Sharad Kumar Singh, the Executive Engineer, and Vikas Patel, the Senior Accounts Clerk Barolia stated in his complaint that the duo was de manding a total of Rs 24,000—a 5% bribe from each of them-to clear the

bill. After a swift verification of the complaint the EOW set up a trap and apprehended the of ficials as they accepted the bribe. A case has been filed against both men under the Prevention of Corruption Act. The arrests underscore the EOW's commitment to rooting out corruption in public departments.
