Fifteen tribal language primers developed in Odisha after it faced extinction

Bhubaneswar: The Ministry of Education (MoE) NCERT in collaboration with Central Institute of Indian Languages, Mysuru and Central University of Odisha, Koraput have developed and launched a total number of 117 primers including 89 tribal language primers, Minister of State for Education, Jayant Chaudhary informed the Rájya Sabha in a written reply today. Of the 89 tribal language primers, 15 are from Odisha. There are primers in 15 languages of Odisha (Desia, Kuwi, Gadaba (Gutob), Juang, Kui, Kisan, Santhali (Odia), Savara (Sara), Candi Odia, Ha Odia (Sora), Gondi-Odia, Ho-Odia, Odia, Kandha (Khond), Malto, Munda, Parji (Durua)). Besides, Joyful Mathematics of Class 1 and Class 2 have also been translated into Santhali and Bodo, the Minister said.

Two youths killed as speeding truck drags bike 200 mts in Chitrakoot; truck catches fire

Chitrakoot: In a tragic accident on the Jhansi-Mirzapur National Highway, a speeding truck rammed into a motorcycle from behind near Chakmali village under the Karwi Kotwali area late Tuesday night around 10 PM. The truck dragged the bike for nearly 200 metres, leading to a fire that engulfed the vehicle. Both bike riders died on the spot, while the truck driver and cleaner fled the scene. The victims have been identified as 40year-old Ram Sajeevan, a resident of Chanhat village under Mau police station (currently living near the RTO office in Karwi), and Lovekush, alias Monty, a resident of Kalupur. The two were reportedly headed towards Badi Pullia on their motorcycle when the high-speed truck hit them from behind near Karwi.

Dharmasthala burial row: SIT grills informant

Beltangady (Karnataka): The Special Investigation Team (SIT) probing the Dharmasthala mass burial allegations today continued its interrogation of an anonymous complainant who had earlier claimed he buried hundreds of bodies in the village on others' instructions. The complainant had pointed out 17 alleged burial sites, but no major skeletal remains were recovered during excavations, raising doubts about his version. Bones found at one site, skeletal remains recovered in Banglegudde forest, and a skull produced by the complainant have been sent for forensic tests. Soil samples from the dug pits have also been forwarded to FSL to check for traces of decomposed human

MBBS admission fraud detected at Tanda

Medical College Dharamshala; A case of alleged admission fraud has surfaceď at Dr. Rajendra Prasad Government Medical College (RPGMC), Tanda, in Kangra district, where fake documents were reportedly used to secure an MBBS seat. According to principal Dr. Milap Sharma, the fraud came to light yesterday during the ongoing admission process, when the scrutiny committee found irregularities in the certificates submitted by a student named Rashi from Dhaniata, Hamirpur. The seat she claimed on merit number 108 had already been allotted by the university to another candidate, Ashlesh Sahni. On suspicion, the scrutiny committee comprising Dr. Rajesh Goyal, Dr. Praveen Kumar, Dr. Sonia Dhiman, Satya Bhushan, Dr. Kamal Singh, and Gurucharan Singh examined all her documents and found them to be forged.

Fire breaks out as tanker overturns on highway near Mathura, 2 injured

Mathura: A major fire broke out after a chemical-laden tanker overturned on the Jaipur-Bareilly Highway near Mathura, leaving 2 injured.

The incident occurred around 4 am yesterday when the tanker suddenly overturned and one of its four tanks exploded, triggering a massive blaze. Flames rose up to 20 feet high, and thick plumes of smoke were visible from over a kilometer away.

Eyewitnesses reported hearing a loud explosion before the fire engulfed the vehicle. Fortunately, the tanker driver managed to escape by jumping out in time and fleeing the scene. Local residents rushed to the spot after noticing the fire. Five fire tenders, along with emergency response teams from the nearby refinery, were deployed to the site. It took nearly four hours of intense firefighting to bring the situation under control.

On the third day of the meeting of the Shri Ram Mandir Nirman Samiti in the Ram Katha Museum in Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh, Mishra said that the name of any particular person will not be inscribed in it. Sharing detailed information to the

journalists in the construction committee meeting, chairman of the building construction committee Nipendra Mishra, said that a review was done regarding the rampart and lower plinth.

He said that all the points were discussed in detail on the stone mural of Ram Katha to be installed in the lower plinth. He said that the work of installing three lifts in the Ram temple will start from September 1, 2025, soon the lifts to be installed will reach the

Digital Bharat Nidhi aims to spread broadband connectivity to all GPs, villages

Minister of State for Communications Pemmasani Chandra Sekhar today informed about a set of projects under Digital Bharat Nidhi (DBN) aimed to provide broadband connectivity to all the Gram Panchayats (GPs) and villages in the

The Minister informed Lok Sabha in a written reply: "As per RGI (Registrar General of India) data, out of the total 6,44,131 villages in the country, 6,26,055 are having internet facility (3G/4G) through mobile coverage network as on 30.06.2025.

Highlighting the steps taken for village digitisation, he stated "BharatNet project is being implemented in a phased manner to provide broadband connectivity to all the Gram Panchayats (GPs) and villages in the country. A total of 13,01,193 no. of FTTH connections have been commissioned in the

country through BharatNet."
"The Wi-Fi technology enabled FTTH connections are being used for accessing all type of online services such as e-education, e-health e-governance,e-commerce etc including the usage by farmers in in creasing their knowledge about agriculture and keeping themselves up dated about new developments in agriculture." the Minister added.

He also highlighted several other projects including 4G saturation projects, Border Out Posts (BoP) and Border Intelligence Posts (BiP) under the umbrella of Digital Bharat Nidhi

Kolkata: The Sundarbans Tiger Reserve (STR) in South 24 Parganas, a UNESCO heritage site, is set to become India's second-largest tiger reserve after the Union government cleared a proposal by West Bengal to include three ranges in the state's southernmost district, official sources



work order to Centre, AP on Polavaram project

Expressing deep concern over the submergence of large areas in Odisha's Malkangiri district due to the Polavaram Project in Andhra Pradesh and its adverse effect on livelihoods of thousands of tribal people, especially those from Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups, the Biju Janata Dal today submitted a memorandum to the Chairman Central Water Commission (CWC) at New Delhi seeking safeguarding of the larger interest of the would-beaffected people in the State.

Seeking reassessing of the sub-mergence levels and revision of the Polavaram project accordingly to prevent any adverse impact on Odisha, BJD called upon the CWC to issue a stop work order to the Government of Andhra Pradesh and the Union Government until the de-



mands of Odisha are addressed.

Demanding initiation of a consultation process with all the concerned Chief Ministers through the CWC, BJD called for the prioritization of the safety and well-being of the tribconducting proper surveys and iden-tifying the areas likely to be sub-

Stating that despite the recommendations of experts and Odisha Government's concerns regarding the safety of tribal populations and people of Malkangiri district, the BJD pointed out that CWC has refused to conduct a fresh backwater study for the revised design flood.

In spite of the assurance given by CWC, no proactive step has yet been taken by it regarding proposal of Odisha to conduct fresh backwater studies to reexamine the various statutory and regulatory clearance to consider the facts of the flood in Malkangiri and upstream of Polavaram as it was witnessed in July 2022, the regional party said in the

BJP finalises inquiry report into Surya Hansda encounter; Arjun Munda alleges conspiracy over minerals

The BJP's seven-member committee formed to examine the death of Surya Hansda in a police encounter in Godda on August 11 met at the party's state office today, and finalised its report. The report will be submitted to state party president Babulal

Marandi. Those present at the meeting included former Chief Minister Arjun Munda, former Leader of Opposition Amar Kumar Bauri, former MP Sunil Soren and party spokespersons Amit Mandal and Anita Soren.

Arjun Munda, who led the team to Lalmatia earlier, said family members and local residents believed the en-

counter was staged.

He alleged that Hansda's opposi-



tion to illegal mining had brought him into conflict with vested interests. He also pointed out that Hansda's name did not figure in the case in

which the encounter was shown. He added that Hansda had been engaged in social work, particularly the education of poor children, and said the BJP would continue to pursue the matter and stand with the family. The party is expected to announce a protest programme in the coming days.

Munda said the incident appeared to be part of a conspiracy linked to minerals and that the committee's findings would guide the party's further course of action.

Former minister and BJP leader Lobin Hembrom said the encounter had created unease. While noting that he had contested elections against Hansda, he said the killing could not be justified. He also raised questions over the role of JMM state secretary Pankaj Mishra, against whom Hans-

da's family has made allegations. Hansda, earlier associated with the BJP, contested the last Assembly election on a JLKMP ticket after being denied a JMM nomination.

Manipur Governor reviews development and security measures in Churachandpur
