Small Industries are backbone of economy: CM Mohan Yadav

Bhopal: Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav asserted that the prosperity of industries is intrinsically linked to national progress, particularly highlighting the role of small and cottage industries as the backbone of the Indian economy. Speaking at the inauguration of Laghu Udyog Bharati's new state office, 'Udyam Setu', in the Govindpura Industrial Area, Dr. Yadav emphasized that the state is committed to promoting the growth of these industries by optimally utilizing limited resources.

The office, constructed at a cost of approximately Rs. 4 crore, was inaugurated amid Vedic chants and coincided with Laghu Udyog Bharati's bi-annual regional convention and the Startup & Small Entrepreneurs Mahakumbh-2025. During the event, the Chief Minister announced the release of mortgaged properties upon the repayment of institutional loans, a provision aimed at benefiting micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs).

Student killed, 3 injured in Arunachal hostel fire

Itanagar: A devastating fire broke out at the boys' hostel of Papikrong School in Arunachal Pradesh's Shi Yomi district in the early hours of Sunday, claiming the life of one student and injuring three others. The tragic incident, which occurred between 1:00 and 2:00 am, is suspected to have been caused by a short circuit. The blaze completely destroyed the hostel building, official sources confirmed. While the charred student is yet to be identified, the injured students - Lukhi Pujen (8), Tanu Pujen (9), and Tayi Pujen (11) - are currently undergoing treatment at the Zonal General Hospital in Aalo, West Siang district. Education Minister and local MLA Pasang Dorjee Sona expressed deep shock and grief over the tragedy.

Anish Dayal Singh appointed Deputy NSA

The Government of India has appointed former Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) Director General Anish Dayal Singh as the new Deputy National Security Advisor (NSA). Singh will primarily oversee internal security affairs, including Jammu and Kashmir, Naxal-affected regions, and the Northeast, according to official sources.

Singh brings over three decades of

experience in intelligence and counter-terrorism to one of India's top security posts.

Anish Dayal Singh, a 1988-batch Indian Police Service (IPS) officer from the Manipur cadre, retired in December 2024 after nearly four decades of service. His career highlights include almost 30 years in the Intelligence Bureau (IB), leadership roles as head of the ITBP and the CRPF.

Singh's mandate as Deputy NSA includes managing internal security challenges, with a special focus on conflict-prone and insurgency-affected areas such as Jammu and Kashmir, Naxal-affected zones, and the Northeastern states. This appointment positions him alongside other senior security officials, including former RAW chief Rajinder Khanna (Additional NSA), IPS officer TV Ravichandran, and former IFS officer Pawan Kapoor, who are also serving as deputy NSAs.

Enthusiastic supporter kisses Rahul Gandhi during Voter Rights Yatra in Purnea



An unusual moment created a stir during Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's ongoing Voter Adhikar Yatra when an overly enthusiastic supporter broke through the crowd here and kissed him while he was riding a motorcycle.

The incident happened on Sunday afternoon as Gandhi, accompanied by Bihar Pradesh Congress Committee President as a pillion rider, was moving through densely packed streets.

Suddenly a youth clad in maroon coloured shirt and black trousers, breached the security directly, went close to Gandhi and kissed him in a haste.

The sudden act surprised both the Congress leader and his security team. Security personnel quickly intervened and pulled the man away, sparking debate about the safety arrangements in place during such large-scale political rallies.



The videos of the incident circulating widely on social media, shows Gandhi smiling and continuing the journey, even as his guards struggled to maintain order around him.

Meanwhile Congress local leaders raised concerns about the frequent crowd breaches witnessed during the yatra.

As it is, Rahul Gandhi who launched the Voter Adhikar Yatra on August 17, was talking out a motorcycle yatra in Purnea on Sunday. The campaign is aimed at protesting alleged irregularities in the voter list revision exercise.

Gandhi has repeatedly accused the Election Commission of sidelining marginalized communities, migrant workers, and the poor, claiming that the process amounts to "vote theft."

The 16-day march is scheduled to pass through over 20 districts, culminating with a grand rally in Patna on September 1.

Several leaders of the INDIA bloc, including Tejaswi Yadav were actively participating to strengthen the opposition's collective voice ahead of the state elections.

Documents of 98.2% electors received in SIR exercise in Bihar: ECI

New Delhi: The Election Commission has received documents of 98.2 per cent of electors in Bihar with eight days left in the Claims, Objections and Documents period of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral roll in the state, the ECI said on Sunday. According to the press note by the ECI, as per information received from the office of the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO), Bihar, from June 24 to August 24, 2025, in 60 days, 98.2 per cent of persons have submitted their documents.

This means an average of about 1.64 per cent per day. There are still eight days to go till September 1, with just 1.8 per cent of electors remaining for submission of the documents.

India successfully conducts Gaganyaan crew module Air drop Test



marking a major step forward in India's maiden human flight mission scheduled for next year.

The official said Indian Air Force helicopter lifted the four ton Gaganyaan crew module and took it up to a height of about four kilometers and dropped it over the Bay of Bengal.

The purpose of the test is to check whether the crew modules' two parachutes get deployed to decelerate and ensure safe splash down.

On its landing in the sea, an Indian Navy vessel took it on board with its crane.

The parachutes for this test were developed by the Defence Research Development Organisation (DRDO).

There are several other tests that are to be carried out before India can put its astronaut into a human-rated rocket and send him to the space.

ISRO said the Gaganyaan project envisages demonstration of human spaceflight capability by launching three crew members to an orbit of 400 km for a 3-day mission and bring them back safely to earth, by landing in Indian sea waters.

PM Modi to launch Rs 5,400 cr projects in Gujarat today

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Gujarat on 25th - 26th August. He will inaugurate, lay the foundation stone and dedicate to the nation multiple development projects worth Rs 5,400 crores at Khodaldham ground, Ahmedabad, at around 6 PM on 25th August. He will also address a public function.

According to a release from the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), on August 26, at around 10:30 AM, the Prime Minister will inaugurate localised production of hybrid battery electrodes and flag off Battery electric vehicle exports to 100 countries at Hansalpur, Ahmedabad. He will also address the gathering on the occasion.

In line with his commitment to world-class infrastructure and connectivity, the Prime Minister will dedicate multiple railway projects worth over Rs 1,400 crore to the Nation.



It includes doubling of the 65 km Mahesana-Palanpur Rail Line worth over Rs 530 crore, gauge conversion of the 37 km Kalol-Kadi-Katson Road Rail Line and 40 km Becharaji-Ranuj Rail Line worth over Rs 860 crore.

With the addition of broad-gauge capacity, these projects will ensure smoother, safer and more seamless connectivity in the region.
