

Appeals Court invalidates Trump's global tariffs

Washington/ New Delhi (UNI) A federal Appeals court has rejected former President Trump's claim that emergency powers under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) justify the imposition of sweeping global tariffs—delivering a significant blow to his efforts to reshape international trade policy.



The court said, "The Government appeals a decision of the Court of International Trade setting aside five Executive Orders that imposed tariffs of unlimited duration on nearly all goods from nearly every country in the world, holding that the tariffs were not authorised by the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA), 50 U.S.C. § 1701 et seq. Because we agree that IEEPA's grant of presidential authority to "regulate" imports does not authorise the tariffs imposed by the Executive Orders, we affirm," the order said.

In a 7-4 decision, the US Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit affirmed a lower court's ruling that the tariffs were not authorised by the statute Trump cited to justify them. The International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) authorises the president to issue certain economic sanctions to counter an "unusual and extraordinary threat" in an emergency, but it does not permit the president's sweeping moves, the court ruled.

Seven people buried under landslide, four dead in cloudburst

Jammu: At least four people were killed and one is missing in a cloudburst in Ramban, while seven of a family are buried under debris as heavy rains triggered a landslide in the Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir. Officials here said that four persons have died and one is missing in the Rajgarh area of Ramban. Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh posted on X, "Just now spoke to DC Ramban Mohammad Alyas Khan. Cloudburst in the Rajgarh area resulting in the unfortunate casualty of four persons."

PM Narendra Modi speaks with President Zelenskyy

Both leaders reiterated commitment to further strengthening bilateral partnership

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi spoke with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy on Saturday, reiterating India's unwavering stance on a peaceful resolution to the ongoing conflict. The telephonic conversation focused on recent developments in Ukraine and a review of the bilateral relationship between the two nations.



The two leaders also took stock of the progress in the India-Ukraine bilateral partnership. They discussed ways to further strengthen cooperation in all areas of mutual interest, agreeing to remain in contact to advance their shared goals.

Drugs worth Rs 4 cr seized from Uganda woman in Bhopal

Accused suspected to be linked to larger drug trafficking network

Bhopal: The capital of Madhya Pradesh is increasingly becoming a focal point for drug trafficking. In the past 15 days, the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) has conducted significant operations, marking its third major crackdown on narcotics in the region. The latest incident occurred on Friday at the Bhopal railway station, where authorities seized narcotic substances, including crystal meth and cocaine, from a Ugandan woman, valued at approximately 4 crores.



The woman, identified as Nabayunga Jariya, was traveling from Delhi to Mumbai aboard the Amritsar-CSTM train. Upon the train's arrival in Bhopal at 9:30 AM, a joint operation by the DRI and Railway Police resulted in her being detained. A search revealed 147 grams of cocaine and 370 grams of crystal meth in her possession. Authorities suspect that Jariya is linked to a large drug trafficking network.

Crystal meth which is also called ice or glass, is an extremely addictive synthetic drug. It is prepared using hazardous chemicals like lithium, acid, and iodine. Experts warn that it is more harmful than most illegal drugs. It can lead to severe health damage including insomnia, brain impairment and in some cases, death.

Brutal murder of Kalkaji temple Pujari sparks political row

New Delhi: The murder of a Pujari from Kalkaji temple has triggered a political row in the capital, with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) holding the BJP-led central government and Delhi Police responsible for what it termed a collapse of law and order in the city. Addressing a press conference on Saturday, AAP MLA Anil Jha said the incident was not only a case of murder but also "an attack on faith."

Bhopal: The Madhya Pradesh state government has announced the promotion of two senior Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officers, Deepali Rastogi and Shivshekhar Shukla, to the rank of Additional Chief Secretary (ACS). The promotions, effective immediately, recognize their long-standing service and contributions to the state administration.



Both officers are from the 1994 IAS batch. Notably, the promotions do not change their existing portfolios. Deepali Rastogi will continue to serve as ACS of the Panchayat and Rural Development Department, with the additional charge of Development Commissioner. Meanwhile, Shivshekhar Shukla will remain as ACS for the Culture and Tourism Department, along with his responsibilities as Commissioner and Director of the Swaraj Institute, and Trustee Secretary of Bharat Bha-

Tourism Conclave attracts Rs 3,500 crore in investment proposals

Gwalior: Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav announced that the Regional Tourism Conclave in Gwalior has attracted investment proposals totaling a staggering Rs 3,500 crore. During the event, Letters of Allotment were issued to six investors for seven plots of land, promising an immediate injection of over Rs 60 crore and the creation of numerous jobs.

Top infiltration guide Bagu Khan killed in Gurez encounter

Srinagar: Security forces have identified one of the two terrorists killed in an encounter in Jammu and Kashmir's Gurez sector two days ago as Bagu Khan, popularly known as the "human GPS" for his unmatched knowledge of infiltration routes along the Line of Control. A top guide, Khan had been on the radar of security agencies for decades for facilitating nearly 100 infiltration attempts. Top security officials said Khan originally a resident of Bandipora district, crossed over to Pakistan-occupied Kashmir in 1995 for arms training. Since then, he had been active in guiding infiltrators across the treacherous Gurez sector. "He had a terrific knowledge of the Gurez sector and was instrumental in helping terrorists infiltrate from here," said a senior security officer, terming his killing "a major success for the forces."
