

Congress inaugurates long-awaited library at Bhopal HQ



Bhopal: In a significant development for the Madhya Pradesh Congress, the party's

state office has officially opened a new library, fulfilling a long-standing demand from its workers and officials. The inauguration was led by State Congress In-charge Harish Chaudhary, marking a new chapter in the party's intellectual and ideological growth.

The library was established under the guidance of State Congress President Jitu Patwari, who envisions it as a hub for intellectual empowerment. Political ripples: A floundering rally, a power play, and an unusual promotion

By Kanhaiya Lodhi Bhopal: Political intrigue is rife following the abrupt cancellation of a rally for a prominent central minister in a district adjacent to the state capital. The event, highly anticipated by party cadres, was scrapped at the last minute. Sources indicate that the minister, upon receiving discouraging feedback on attendance just before his arrival, opted not to proceed. The fallout has sparked a flurry of speculation within political circles: Was this a spontaneous failure, or was it a calculated move? The question on everyone's lips is whether a rival faction intentionally sabotaged the event. If so, it would raise serious concerns about the internal unity of the ruling party.

A high-stakes rally falls flat

The apex of power: In a move that has sent shockwaves through the bureaucracy, the state's Chief Secretary has been granted an unprecedented one-year extension. This decision, a first in the state's history, is a masterclass in power politics. The Chief Secretary is not only favored by Delhi but is also said to be closely aligned with a highly influential official in the Prime Minister's Office. It's rumored that this powerful figure intervened at the eleventh hour to secure the extension, bypassing conventional protocols and highlighting the immense clout wielded by certain individuals at the highest levels of government.

A house of two bureaucrats: In a rare instance of bureaucratic serendipity, a single household in Madhya Pradesh now boasts two officers at the Additional Chief Secretary (ACS) rank. The Rastogi couple, Manish Rastogi and Deepali Rastogi, have both attained this prestigious position. As Manish Rastogi was being lauded for his promotion in one part of the secretariat, news of Deepali Rastogi's elevation began to spread, with congratulations pouring in even before the official orders were released. This dual achievement marks a remarkable milestone for the family and underscores a unique convergence of

professional success within the corridors of power. A bold reprimand or a mere scolding? A recent incident involving a BJP MLA clashing with a district collector led to a summoning of the legislator to the state capital. He was met by three senior party leaders tasked with admonishing him. While the official narrative suggests a stern reprimand, a photograph of the meeting tells a different story. The MLA's body language in the shared image appears not

defensive but defiantly aggressive. This begs the question: What message does such an audacious posture in front of party stalwarts convey? It raises doubts about the effectiveness of the "scolding" and whether it will serve as a lesson for the lawmaker or his peers. The coming days will reveal if the party's disciplinary action will have any tangible effect.

RTO recovers over Rs 1.28 cr in motor vehicle tax arrears



Bhopal: In a special campaign directed by the Transport Commissioner, the Regional Transport Office (RTO) of Bhopal has reported significant success in recovering motor vehicle tax arrears. During July and August, the RTO collected a total of over Rs 1.28 crores, which includes both tax arrears and mitigation fees.

Notably, on August 30, the RTO intensified its efforts by specifically targeting passenger buses. During this operation, strict actions were enforced against vehicles violating multiple sections of the Motor Vehicles Act.

RTO Jitendra Sharma confirmed that this recovery campaign will continue in the future. He emphasized that stringent action will be taken against vehicles that fail to pay their outstanding taxes and those that violate traffic regulations.
