Two dead, 22 injured as thousands protest against Pak govt in PoK

Internet suspended, Troops deployed after protestors clash with security forces

In Pakistan-occupied Kashmir's (PoK) capital Muzaffarabad today, unarmed Kashmiris protesting against the Pakistani government were attacked with gunfire by Pakistani police and members of the pro-government party Muslim Conference. So far, two people have been killed and 18 others injured. According to reports, the incident took place around 1 pm IST at the Neelum Bridge in Muzaffarabad.

PoK is witnessing conditions akin to a civil war. People are physically confronting Pakistani police and paramilitary Frontier Corps, seizing their batons, helmets, and shields. Merchants across all districts of PoK, frustrated with the Pakistani government, have shut down shops, imposing a de facto lockdown. Whether in Mirpur, Muzaffarabad, or Rawalakot, shops remain closed, and people are taking to the streets against the Pakistani authorities.

Under the banner of the Awami Action Committee, a shutdown was called across all districts of PoK. People took to the streets to protest against decades of dis-



crimination by the Pakistani government. As soon as demonstrators reached the Neelum River bridge in Muzaffarabad,

Pakistani police and paramilitary forces first fired tear gas shells and warning shots into the air.


Clashes broke out with stone-pelting from both sides. In the meantime, hundreds of non-Kashmiri armed workers of the Muslim Conference a party supporting the Pakistani government, arrived at the Neelum Bridge and opened fire directly at the Kashmiri protesters. ABP News has accessed exclusive video of the firing.

The exchange of fire by non-Kashmiris from other parts of Pakistan continued for about half an hour, leading to the deaths of two people aged between 22 and 25, and leaving 18 others injured.

To suppress the shutdown, the Pakistani government has deployed more than 2,000 paramilitary Frontier Corps and Islamabad police personnel across PoK.

Exclusive images and videos obtained by ABP News from the Kohala area of PoK's capital, Muzaffarabad, show Kashmiris beating Frontier Corps personnel during protests and looting their equipment.

In retaliation, police and paramilitary forces resorted to stone-pelting against demonstrators.



Trump announces 100% tariff on non-US-made movies

Washington: President Donald Trump said on Monday he would impose a 100% tariff on all films produced overseas that are then sent into the U.S., repeating a threat made in May that would upset Hollywood's global business model. The step signals Trump's willingness to extend protectionist trade policies into cultural industries, raising uncertainty for studios that depend heavily on cross-border co-productions and international box-office revenue.

12 Indian fishermen arrested by Lankan Navy

Chennai: A total of 12 fishermen were arrested by the Sri Lankan Navy in the early hours of today for allegedly fishing in their Territorial waters and confiscated their boats. The fishermen hailed the Karaikal in union Territory of Puducherry and Nagapattinam and Mayiladuthurai districts of Tamil Nadu. The fishermen went for fishing in mechanised boat from Karaikal fishing harbour. The fishermen were fishing in high seas when they were apprehended by the Lankan Navy personnel for allegedly crossing the International Maritime Boundary Line (IMBL) and fishing in the Lankan territory.

Seventeen rescued from stranded bus

Mumbai: In a night time rescue mission, seventeen individuals including sixteen women and their driver were safely evacuated after their bus became stranded near Chari village in Dahanu tehsil of Palghar district yesterday night. The rescue operation was personally supervised by Palghar District Collector Dr Indu Rani Jakhari and Superintendent of Police Yatish Deshmukh, demonstrating the administration's direct involvement in the emergency response.

Two killed in firecracker blast in UP's Fatehpur

Fatehpur/Bijnor: A firecracker explosion in the Kalyanpur area of Fatehpur district killed a man and his daughter today afternoon. The incident occurred while they were making firecrackers at home in preparation for Diwali. The victim's son was critically injured and has been hospitalized. According to the police, Noor Mohammad (50), a resident of Rewari village, was illegally manufacturing firecrackers inside his house with the help of his daughter Tayyaba (20) and son Sher. A sudden explosion shook the neighborhood, prompting locals to alert the authorities.

Nirmala Sitharaman meets families of Karur stampede victims

Advocating a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for public rallies to prevent recurrence of tragic stampedes anywhere in the country, union Finance Minister today said she has come not to pass a verdict on what happened but to meet the families of the victims and the injured to offer condolences and share their grief.

"I have not come here to pass a verdict, but to meet the bereaved families and the injured to convey condolences, listen to them, and share their grief on the direction of the Prime Minister. There is nothing else. But I will report to him and the Home Minister on what I heard," she told the media at Karur in response to a question.

Earlier in the day, she visited a few families of the victims and interacted with the injured at the Government Medical College Hospital after visit-



ing Velusamypuram, where the tragedy took place during Saturday night's massive rally of actor Vijay's Tamilaga Vettai Kazhagam (TVK), which claimed 41 lives.

On the urgency of evolving an SOP for public gatherings, she said, we are rather too late, unlike other countries. But no time is a bad time for bringing an SOP, particularly when there are huge assemblies.

PM lays foundation for Rs 624 Cr IIT Indore expansion



The massive funding, approved under the Higher Education Funding Agency's third phase, is allocated for state-of-the-art academic buildings (Rs 374.38 crore), residential complexes (Rs 123.15 crore), and advanced equipment (Rs 27.04 crore).

Key facilities to be added include an Industrial Research Park, a dedicated Design Department, a Student Activity Centre, and a Visitor's Hostel.
