Minor raped by fiance, accused held

Bhopal: A 17-and-a-half-year-old girl from Bilkhiriya was allegedly raped by her fiancé, Vivek Tiwari, on September 27. According to police reports, the incident occurred after the girl had ceased communication with Vivek following the incident of This lowing their recent engagement. This change in her behavior reportedly angered him. The survivor, a Class 12 student, had her wedding arranged by her parents with Vivek, who also resides in Bilkhiriya. After their engagement, the girl followed her parents advice to avoid contact until the wedding, which led to Vivek's frustration. On the day of the incident, he approached her under the pretext of discussing their relationship, offering her ride in his car to Hathaikheda Dam.

It was there that he allegedly raped her after questioning her silence. After returning home, the girl confided in her parents, who then confronted Vivek and his family. This confrontation escalated into a dispute, with Vivek's family accusing the girl of having a questionable character and threatening her family. Subsequently, the girl's family filed a police complaint, leading to Vivek's arrest.

Woman struck by drum carried by drunk biker

Victim succumbs to injuries after three days

Bhopal: A tragic road accident occurred near Narmada Bhawan in TT Nagar, on September 25, when a woman was struck by a drum carried by a drunk biker. The impact caused her to fall headfirst onto the road, resulting in to the road, resulting in severe injuries. She succumbed to her injuries three days later

juries three days later while undergoing treatment.

The victim, Sangeeta Singh (48), a resident of Naya Basera, worked as a cleaner at an officer's bungalow. According to her son, Rahul Singh, the incident took place as they were returning from an apartment in TT Nagar where she was employed.

the influence of alcohol attempted to overtake attempted to overtake their motorcycle. His pillion rider was carrying a drum slung over his shoulder. During the overtaking maneuver, the drum struck Sangeeta Singh, causing her to fall violently onto the road.

She was immediately

She was immediately rushed to the hospital but

tragically passed away on Sunday, while receiving treatment. Her body was subsequently handed over to her family following a post-mortem examination.

Police have registered a case and launched an investigation; however, the accused biker has not yet been arrested. Authorities have confirmed that both the rider and the pillion passenger were intoxicated at the time of the incident.

Rs 3 crore bank frauds

Postal bank scam

Bhopal: A student from Makhanlal Chaturvedi National University of and Communication (MCU) and former NSUI unit president, Aman Kumar, has been arrested by Bihar Police on charges of large-scale financial fraud. Kumar and his associates are accused of using over 250 Indian Post Payments Bank (IPPB) accounts—many allegedly opened during his time in Bhopal—for suspicious transactions totaling nearly Rs 3

Luring villagers with 'Government Schemes': The investigation, which began after complaints from villagers in Bihar, exposed a sophisticated racket. The accused allegedly lured people, mostly laborers, by promising them benefits under government schemes. They were offered a paltry of Rs 500 initially and a commission of Rs 2,500 to

Rs 5,000 for each new account opened. Aman, a third-year Mass Communication student, is a native of Khap Gopalpur, Bihar. Police revealed that the scam network was established by a man named Vishal in Bihar, and Aman's introduction to the racket, including a contact named Irshad, started during his schooling. The three are suspected

of collaborating to run the fraud. Accounts flagged After massive transactions: The fraud unraveled after victims, who were denied their passbooks, began receiving notices from the bank. The bank ultimately froze the accounts after realizing the scale of the fraudulent activity, which involved transferring over Rs 3 crore. One victim, a laborer, found his account balance was over Rs 50,000 in debt. Bihar Police seized four mobile phones from the accused, who revealed he had been opening accounts for over two years, operating between


MCU Student caught in Ayodhya Nagar police bust massive cricket betting racket

Arrest 7 and seize approx assets of Rs 50 lakhs

Bhopal: Ayodhya Nagar Zone-2 police delivered a major blow to an illegal online cricket betting syndicate, seizing assets worth approximately Rs 50 lakh and arresting seven individuals in a targeted raid on a call centre (book).

The crackdown uncovered a massive operation with transactions estimated to be in the crores. Police confiscated a large cache of equipment, including 40 mobile phones, 80 SIM cards, 177 ATM cards, 5 laptops, 2 cars, and Rs 3.54 lakh in cash. An additional Rs 15 lakh was successfully frozen in online accounts.

The syndicate, which operated sophisticated betting panel via Instagram and Telegram, employed tactics to evade law en-

They also used fake bank actransactions and WhatsApp communication. Bhopal: A major disaster was narrowly avoided at Bhopal's presti-gious Hamidia College today when a large section of the ceiling in the Principal's office suddenly col-

The incident involved a section of the institution's severely dilapidated old building, which had long been flagged as dangerous.

Fortunately, no one was injured in the collapse, but the event has reignited serious concerns over the neglect of government-run educational facilities.

College authorities stated they have repeatedly alerted the administration about the building's "extremely poor condition" and the urgent need for repair. The incident underscores a systemic failure to address the safety risks posed by aging infrastructure across the city's educational insti-

The collapse has intensified calls for immediate structural audits and maintenance funding. While the dust settles, all eyes are now on the state administration to see what definitive steps will be taken to prevent a similar, potentially tragic, accident in the future.
