MP CM Mohan Yadav Urges Bihar Voters to Crush 'Unholy Alliances'

Bhopal/Patna: Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh, Dr. Mohan Yadav, launched a fiery campaign blitz across Bihar today, appealing to voters in Bagaha, Saharsa, and Sikta to support the NDA. Dr. Yadav's rallies were marked by sharp attacks on the Congress and the Mahagathbandhan, urging the public to treat the election as the rightful time to settle scores with the opposition's past.

Assault on Congress and 'Shameful' Politics

Dr. Yadav harshly criticized Congress, stating that their leaders shame the nation by questioning the valor of the defense forces—a reference made specifically to Rahul Gandhi. "Rahul Gandhi should be ashamed," the CM declared. Comparing the current political situation to the epic tale of Lord Krishna and Shishupala, he warned, "Lord Krishna forgave Shishupala 100 times before cutting his head with the Sudarshan Chakra. You will soon have this 'Su-



darshan Chakra' in your hands (the vote); use it to destroy these unholy alliances."

Family Rule vs. 'Sabka Saath'

The Chief Minister contrasted the dynastic politics of the opposition with the BJP's inclusive ideology. He questioned why one family should perpetually hold the top party posi-

tions, stating: "On one side is the family-centric Congress, and on the other is the BJP, whose mantra is 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, Sabka Prayas.'" He cited his own rise from a humble background to the CM's chair as a prime example of Prime Minister Modi's genuinely democratic, merit-based approach.

From 'Jungle Raj' to Prosperity

Appealing to the state's potential, Dr. Yadav reminded the crowd that it was the people of Bihar who liberated the state from the RJD's "Jungle Raj" in October 2005, choosing good governance instead. "Now is the time to transition that good governance into widespread prosperity," he stated, urging voters to support the NDA to strengthen the nation and ensure the state's development.

Bihar's Unique Link to Lord Ram

Dr. Yadav connected the election to Bihar's cultural pride, reminding the crowd that Lord Ram is the son-in-law of Bihar. He criticized Congress for opposing the construction of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya through various court battles, praising PM Modi's leadership for ensuring that the temple was finally built, allowing the entire nation to celebrate a true Deepawali.

Patwari accuses CM of financial mismanagement, betrayal of farmers and women

Bhopal: Madhya Pradesh Congress President Jeetu Patwari has written an open letter to Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav, accusing his government of betraying the people's trust and pushing the state into "financial anarchy."

Patwari said the people had hoped that a person holding a "doctorate" would govern with "sensitivity and integrity." However, the government's conduct towards farmers and women, he claimed, had "completely shattered that faith."

Citing media reports, Patwari said the government demanded Rs 1,500 crore from the Mandi Board for the Bhavantar Bhugtan Yojana, but Agriculture Minister Endal Singh Kansana admitted that the board lacked such funds. Instead, the government proposed a one per cent hike in mandi fees — effectively burdening farmers further.

Patwari also criticized the state's soaring debt, stating that since July



2023, the Yadav administration has taken loans exceeding Rs 1.12 lakh crore, averaging Rs 5,000-Rs 5,500 crore per month. "If despite this massive borrowing the treasury remains empty, it clearly reflects a state of complete fiscal disorder," he asserted.

Turning to the Ladli Behna Yojana, Patwari alleged that despite the Chief Minister's promise of Rs 250 transfers to women on Bhai Dooj, the funds were not credited due to a budget crisis and lack of finance department approval. "Is this how the government plans to empower women — through hollow announcements and unpaid promises?" he asked.

Patwari warned that if the government fails to ensure transparency and timely disbursement under the Bhavantar and Ladli Behna schemes, the Congress would launch a statewide agitation, exposing what he termed the BJP government's "debt, deceit, and corruption-driven governance."

Carbide Gun Crisis: MP Authorities Move to Ban Dangerous Devices

Gwalior/Rewa: The danger posed by illegal carbide guns is escalating across Madhya Pradesh, prompting decisive action from authorities. The explosive devices, used widely during festive seasons, have caused a wave of severe eye injuries, leading to bans and the first major police arrests.



Banned in Gwalior after 36 Eye Injury Cases Reported; Manufacturer Arrested

Gwalior has become a focal point of the crisis, reporting 36 eye injury cases linked to carbide guns within just 48 hours at major hospitals. An alarming 17 new cases surfaced today, adding to the previous count. Doctors confirmed that eight patients suffered severe damage, with four undergoing emergency surgery after their corneas were burned white. Physicians are monitoring the cases, stating the fate of their vision remains uncertain for at least a week. Following a restriction order issued by Col-

lector Ruchika Chauhan, Gwalior police achieved a significant breakthrough by arresting a local manufacturer. Shahid Ali of Jhadu Wala Mohalla was apprehended while selling the guns. This marks the first major police action against a supplier, reinforcing the ban on the device's sale and use under Section 163 of the law.

Rewa Imposes Total Ban on Carbide Gun Activities

Responding to the statewide danger, Rewa Collector Smt. Pratibha Pal has enforced an immediate and complete ban on the manufacturing, storage, sale, distribution, and display of carbide guns across the district. Citing public interest under the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023, the order mandates strict enforcement by all SDMs, executive magistrates, and police officials. Authorities have warned that any person found using the prohibited device will face harsh legal consequences.
