Sanitation workers protest half salaries, garbage collection halted in several areas

Corporation assures pending payment by November 11



Bhopal: Sanitation workers across Bhopal went on strike on Saturday after receiving only half of their monthly salaries, leading to heaps of garbage accumulating in several localities. The protest began early in the morning, with workers parking their vehicles at municipal offices and refusing to collect garbage. The Kolar area was the worst affected, while other parts of the city also experienced disruptions in cleaning services. Following protest, Corporation officials assured that pending payment would be

According to officials, the issue arose after the Bhopal Municipal Corporation introduced an Aadhaar-based attendance system on October 16, replacing the earlier Sarthak app. Consequently, workers were paid only for the period between October 16 and 31, resulting in half salaries being credited on Friday night. Over 15,000 sanitation workers are employed by the

Half salaries make it impossible to meet family expenses: Dagar

Sonu Dagar, president of the Bharatiya Safai Mazdoor Sangh, said, "Sanitation workers live hand to mouth. Half salaries make it impossible to meet family expenses and pay school fees or loans. The new attendance system should have been implemented from Novem-

Protesting workers raised slogans outside the Kolar office, declaring, "Half pay, full work — this insult will not be tolerated." Union leaders, including Umashankar Tiwari of the Third Class Employees Union, condemned the situation and demanded full payment.

Corporation officials have assured that the remaining salaries will be credited between November 10 and 11. However, garbage collection in Kolar and several adjoining areas remained suspended throughout the day.

Cyber safety alert: Bhopal police warns against CCTV hacking threat

Urgent advisory follows sensitive data breach

Bhopal: Bhopal Police Commissionerate has issued an urgent cyber security advisory to all citizens following a grave incident in Rajkot, Gujarat, where CCTV cameras at a maternity hospital were hacked. The cybercriminals recorded and allegedly viralized highly private and sensitive videos of women. This case serves as a critical warning that security cameras in our homes, businesses, hospitals, and offices can become easy surveillance tools for cybercriminals if not properly secured. Investigations revealed that the primary vulnerability was the failure to change the default username and password (e.g., admin/admin123), which allowed hackers to easily take full control of the camera sys-

Immediate steps to secure your cameras

The advisory mandates immediate actions to prevent CCTV hacking. First and most critically, change the default password immediately to a strong, long password using a mix of letters, numbers, and symbols. If

tion (MFA), which requires a one-time password (OTP) for login, doubling your security. Users must also keep camera software (Firmware) updated to patch security flaws. Furthermore, strengthen your Wi-Fi network password and consider connecting CCTVs to a separate guest network for better isolation.

Protecting privacy and reporting crime

The police also emphasized the need to be mindful of camera placement, urging citizens to avoid installing cameras in private spaces like bedrooms, changing rooms, or bathrooms, restricting their use to essential security areas. For remote viewing, use a VPN and limit remote access only when necessary. The police stressed that a little caution can prevent major cybercrime. However, his cinematic escape was short-lived. Kohefiza


