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Deputy CM Shukla focuses on cottage industries for job creation in Rewa

► One district-one product workshop stresses local economic boost

Bhopal: Deputy Chief Minister Shri Rajendra Shukla emphasized that increasing the establishment of cottage industries and promoting local products is key to generating employment opportunities. He stated that ensuring market availability for products made by local entrepreneurs will lead to their economic prosperity.

Shri Shukla made these remarks while attending a 'One District-One Product' (ODOP) and Export Promotion Workshop, jointly organized by the District Administration and MPIDC (Madhya Pradesh Industrial Development Corporation) at Eco Park.

The Deputy CM highlighted that the nation's economic growth is dependent on education, health, and self-employment, noting India's rapid progress towards economic self-reliance. He also announced that a 'Haat Bazaar' (local market) would be constructed near Vyankat Bhawan in Rewa to showcase and sell local goods.



Bamboo lady provides training for global market

Shukla praised MPIDC officials for inviting Neeramo Sharma, famously known as the 'Bamboo Lady of India' from Assam, to the workshop. Ms. Sharma detailed how small bamboo items require less material but can yield higher incomes, urging local people to cultivate bamboo and reduce plastic use.

She assured attendees that she would provide training in Rewa for making bamboo-based products, including jewelry. Furthermore, the Deputy CM called for a strong network of cottage industries beyond ODOP, benefiting thousands of local residents. Divisional Forest Officer Lokesh Nagpur said that over 2.64 lakh bamboo plants were planted by 175 farmers in recent years, ensuring a steady supply for the artisans. A Walmart representative also provided information on market linkage through their platform.

Bhopal: The administrative and political landscape is currently buzzing with internal tensions and missed opportunities, according to sources within the government corridors.

Negative marking for the boss

A recent official order concerning "Dharti Putras" (farmers) sparked significant controversy, despite allegedly receiving prior approval from a top Ministry official. When public pressure mounted, the senior authority quickly reversed course, making a field officer the scapegoat for the flub. Insiders suggest the hasty damage control and the initial approval error have resulted in "negative marking" for the high-ranking boss.

Snub on stage

During the recent, elaborate three-day Madhya Pradesh Foundation Day celebrations, a highly anticipated performance by a renowned singer failed to connect with the audience. In a visible attempt to salvage the show, the singer approached a senior government figure present, offering them a spot on the stage for a duet. The official, however, politely declined with a smile, leaving the singer's efforts to generate excitement unsuccessful.

Fading firebrand's future

The low turnout at a recent



non-political rally organized by a former "firebrand" leader has political analysts dissecting the event's significance.

Despite raising a relevant contemporary issue, the rally failed to attract a sufficient crowd, even among ideology loyalists. Analysts now suggest the leader's past failure to make a "timely decision" has resulted in a major political misstep, making her future in Madhya Pradesh appear increasingly bleak.

Metro hopes derailed by divided focus

Hopes of inaugurating the Bhopal Metro by October or November were dashed, primarily due to departmental delays. The anticipation for a grand launch is now overshadowed by worry over the slow pace.

A key concern is that senior officials overseeing the project are distracted by other high-profile responsibilities, notably in Indore and the IT Department. This divided focus is severely dampening the expected progress, raising questions about accountability.

Model rate of Rs 4,033 per quintal for soybean released

Bhopal: Farmers Welfare and Agriculture Development Minister Edal Singh Kansana has announced that, under the Bhavantar Scheme 2025, a model rate of Rs 4,033 per quintal was released on November 8 for soybean-selling farmers. This model rate applies to those who have sold their soybean produce in the Mandis. The Bhavantar amount will be calculated based on this model rate.

Kansana reported that there is significant enthusiasm for the Bhavantar Scheme among farmers in the markets. A total of 936,352 farmers have registered

under the scheme.

Since its inception, 1,44,180 farmers have sold soybean at 243 Mandis and Up-Mandis. The highest soybean arrivals under the scheme have been recorded in agricultural produce market committees at Ganjbasoda, Dewas, Ujjain, Indore and Agar. The marketing process across the markets is being conducted smoothly.

Kanshana emphasised that the state government is farmer-friendly. To ensure soybean producers get the full benefit of the MSP, an additional Rs 1,300 per quintal will be paid to them.

No water supply from Kolar line today

Bhopal: There will be no water supply from the Kolar line in the capital Bhopal on Sunday. This will affect more than 60 areas including Arera Colony, Arif Nagar, Hamidia Road, Shivaji Nagar, Tulsi Nagar. This will happen due to maintenance work on both feeders supplying electricity to the Kolar Water Supply Project. There will be a shutdown for this from 10 am to 6 pm. Due to this, the water tanks will not be able to fill and the supply system will be affected. Water will be supplied on Monday after the tanks are filled. Areas to be affected include Barkhedhi Kalan, Shivaji Nagar, Tulsi Nagar, E-6 Arera Colony area, Janta Quarters, Bank Colony, E-7 Arera Colony, Dana Pani, Fortune, Shalimar, Arif Nagar, Nishatpura, Bagh Nuzhat Afza, Hamidia Road, Cantonment, Patel Nagar, Sangam Talkies, Qazi Camp Road, Ibrahimipura, Marwari Road, Kotwali Road, Mangalwara, Itwara, Azad Market, Islampura, Police Station, Budhwara, Wahidiya School, Pathar Wali Gali, Noormahal Road, Hawa Mahal Road, Shastri Nagar, 228 Quarters, New MLA Quarters and other areas.



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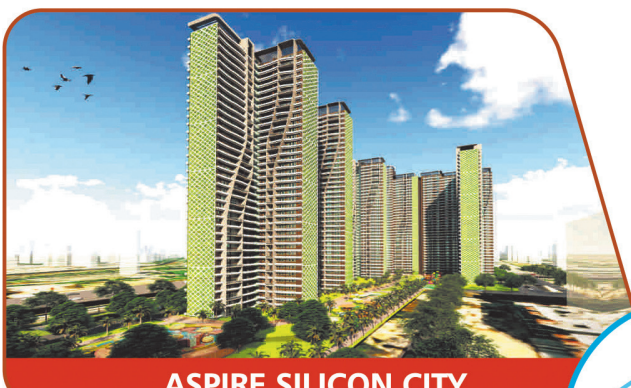


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
