### Over 12,000 litres of fake petrol seized by Godda Police

**Godda (Jharkhand):** In a late-night operation, the Godda Mufassil police seized more than 12,000 litres of fake petrol from two tankers on Friday. Acting on a tip-off, police intercepted the vehicles that were allegedly transporting illegal inflammable substances from Banka to Bihar via Sarkanda, Godda. According to police sources, upon receiving the confidential information, a team led by Officer-in-Charge Anand Saha swiftly launched an operation. The police set up a checkpoint near Singhwahini Bridge on the Pakur-Godda main road.

### AP: Three killed as car ploughs through crowd

**Rajahmundry:** Three persons were killed and five others were injured when a car ploughed through them when they were waiting at a bus stop at Somavaram village of Kirlampudi mandal in combined East Godavari district on Saturday. Police said that the car which was coming from a marriage function ploughed through the crowd of people who were waiting at a bus stop. Three persons were killed instantaneously and five others, including two girl students, were injured in the incident.

### DRI seizes crystal meth worth Rs1.95 cr at calicut airport

**Kochi:** The Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) has foiled a drug smuggling attempt at the Calicut International Airport, recovering nearly 1 kg of Crystal Methamphetamine from a passenger who arrived from Muscat. Based on specific intelligence, officers of the DRI Calicut Regional Unit, under the Cochín Zonal Unit, intercepted a passenger from Thrissur and recovered 19 packets of crystal methamphetamine, weighing 974.5 grams, concealed inside a diaper packet in his checked-in baggage.

### NIA conducts raids in Chhattisgarh in 2023 Maoist ambush case

**New Delhi:** The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Friday carried out searches at twelve locations across the Dantewada and Sukma districts of Chhattisgarh's Bastar region. The raids were conducted as part of an ongoing investigation into a 2023 case involving an IED blast and ambush attack perpetrated by armed cadres of the proscribed CPI (Maoist) organisation. According to officials, the searches were held at the premises of suspects and accused persons connected to the Aranpur IED Blast case. The attack, carried out by members of the Darbha Division Committee of the CPI (Maoist), occurred near Pedka village under the Aranpur police station limits in Dantewada district on April 26, 2023.

### BJP alleges 'secret alliance' between Cong and Jamaat-e-Islami in Kerala

**Kottayam:** BJP Kerala State Vice President Advocate Shon George has alleged that Congress is secretly aligning with Jamaat-e-Islami across the state, accusing the party of compromising national interests for electoral gains. Speaking on the political situation in Erattupetta, Shon George said that although the Congress publicly claims to have "no tacit understanding" with Jamaat-e-Islami or its political wing, the Welfare Party of India, the links between them are now evident.

# Modi urges voters to reject 'Katta Sarkar', coins slogan 'Once Again NDA Govt'

Accusing the opposition of poisoning the minds of Bihar's youth with a dangerous mentality, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday alleged that "RJD and Congress leaders come into politics only to loot people and restore the old system of corruption and fear and to bring back katta, crime and Goondaraj in Bihar."

Concluded his election campaign for the Bihar Assembly poll with a massive rally in West Champaran's Betiah, Modi urged voters to defeat the RJD-Congress alliance, which he said represents the return of corruption, crime, and jungle raj, and to ensure "Once Again NDA Government in Bihar."

## ECI acts swiftly on poll irregularities in Bihar and Punjab, orders inquiry and suspensions

**New Delhi (UNI)**

The Election Commission of India has taken immediate and firm action following reports of irregularities during election-related activities in Samastipur, Bihar, and Tarn Taran, Punjab. The Commission confirmed in a statement today that investigations and disciplinary measures are underway to preserve the integrity of the electoral process.

In Samastipur, Chief Election Commissioner directed the District Magistrate to conduct an on-the-spot inquiry after Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) slips from a mock poll were found, raising concerns among stakeholders. The ECI clarified that these slips are part of routine mock polling exercises and affirmed that the overall election process remains secure and uncom-



promised. Candidates contesting in the area have been informed about the developments.

However, the Commission took serious note of negligence by the Assistant Returning Officer (ARO) connected to the incident.

### ECI warns strict action against BLOs skipping door-to-door visits

**Kolkata:** The Election Commission of India has warned that booth-level officers (BLOs) in West Bengal skipping mandatory door-to-door visits while distributing enumeration forms for the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) will face stringent disciplinary action. According to sources in the office of the Chief Electoral Officer, West Bengal, the Commission has instructed both the CEO and the District Electoral Officers to take action as per rules against any BLO found violating the directive.

### BJP leader shot dead in Saharanpur, police launch probe

**Saharanpur:** A local Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader was found shot dead at his residence in Saharanpur district on Saturday morning.

The body of 65-year-old Dharam Singh, Mandal Vice President of Ambheta, was discovered lying on a cot in the courtyard behind his house in Didoli village under the Nakur police station limits.

According to police, Singh's daughter-in-law discovered the body when she went to serve him tea early in the morning.

On finding him lying in a pool of blood, she raised an alarm, following which family members and villagers rushed to the spot.

Police and forensic teams arrived shortly after and collected evidence from the scene. Superintendent of Police (Rural) Sagar Jain also visited the site for inspection.

## Winter Session of Parliament scheduled for Dec 1-19, 2025



**New Delhi (UNI)**

The government today announced that the Winter Session of Parliament will be held from December 1 to December 19, 2025, marking the final legislative session of the calendar year.

Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju confirmed the dates on social media platform X, stating that

President Droupadi Murmu has approved the government's proposal for the session.

"The President of India, Droupadi Murmu ji has approved the proposal of the Government to convene the Winter Session of Parliament from 1st December 2025 to 19th December, 2025 (subject to exigencies of Parliamentary business)," Rijiju said. He added, "looking forward to a constructive & meaningful Session that strengthens our democracy & serves the aspirations of the people."

The session, slated for 15 sittings, will focus on key legislative business, including major bills such as the Government of union Territories (Amendment) Bill, 2025, Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation (Amendment) Bill, 2025, and the Constitution (One Hundred and Thirtieth Amendment) Bill, 2025.

### Third FIR against BJP MLA Hans Raj under POCSO Act

**Chamba:** A third FIR has been registered against BJP MLA Hans Raj from Churah in Chamba district. Filed on Friday evening under the POCSO Act, the complaint alleges that the MLA physically abused the victim when she was a minor. Her statement has been recorded in court, and a medical examination has been conducted.

According to DSP Hitesh Lakhanpal, a case has been registered based on the victim's complaint and the police are investigating all aspects.

The victim's father had filed another FIR against Hans Raj, his personal secretary Lekh Raj, and another individual, Muniyan Khan on Thursday.

# Two terrorists killed as Army foils infiltration bid

**Srinagar (UNI)**

Two unidentified terrorists were eliminated after security forces foiled an infiltration attempt along the Line of Control (LoC) in the Keran sector of Jammu and Kashmir's Kupwara district, the Army said on Friday.

The encounter broke out after alert troops spotted suspicious movement near the LoC late last night and challenged the infiltrators, who opened indiscriminate fire. The troops retaliated, leading to an exchange of gunfire.

"Two terrorists have been neutralised by the security forces in the ongoing operation," the Army's Srinagar based Chinara Corps said on X.

Earlier, the Army said troops launched a joint operation based on



specific intelligence inputs about a possible infiltration bid in the sector.

"On 07 Nov 2025, based on specific intelligence input from agencies, regarding an infiltration attempt, a joint operation was launched in the Keran sector of Kupwara. Alert

troops spotted suspicious activity and challenged, which resulted in terrorists opening indiscriminate fire. Contact was established and terrorists were trapped," the Chinara Corps said.

## Four friends die in tragic road accident in Shamli

**Shamli:** A road accident claimed the lives of four youngsters on the Panipat- Khatima Highway near the Butrada flyover. A Swift car traveling at high speed collided with a stationary canter parked on the roadside, resulting in a devastating crash, police said on Saturday.

The impact was extremely severe, the car was completely destroyed, and its parts were scattered along the road for nearly 100 meters. The roof of the vehicle was torn off, and a four occupants were trapped inside. Emergency teams had to cut open the car to remove the bodies. The canter also sustained heavy damage, with its rear portion and cabin badly crushed.

Police officials from Babri Police Station reached the scene immediately after receiving information. Additional Superintendent of Police (ASP) Santosh Kumar Singh also inspected the accident site. The bodies have been sent for post-mortem examination.

## Anna Hazare comments on Ajit Pawar Land Scam

### Anna Hazare comments on Ajit Pawar Land Scam

If the children of ministers are involved in misconduct and corruption, the responsibility lies with the ministers themselves, said veteran social activist Anna Hazare here on Saturday.

Talking to reporters, he emphasised the importance of family and social values in shaping a person's character.

"When a minister's child engages in wrongdoing, the concerned minister must be held accountable. Strict action should be taken in such cases," Hazare stated. He was reacting to the alleged land scam in



Pune's elite Koregaon Park area, in which Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar and his son Parth Pawar have been accused of irregularities.

"If influential political figures or their associates are involved in corruption, the government

should adopt a special policy to ensure strict and impartial action against them," he said." The controversy pertains to a 40-acre land deal in Koregaon Park, where a company linked to Parth Pawar allegedly purchased property worth Rs 1800 crore for just Rs 300 crore, claiming it was meant for an IT park and data center.

## After Trump's no-show, Jairam Ramesh jabs, hopes PM Modi attends G20

Congress leader Jairam Ramesh today took a sarcastic jab at Prime Minister Narendra Modi, expressing hope that Modi would personally attend the upcoming G20 summit in South Africa. This comment followed reports that US President Donald Trump is likely to boycott the event.

"Now that President Trump has announced he will not be attending the G20 Summit in South Africa on November 22-23, we can be certain that the self-styled Vishwaguru will himself attend in person. Kabhi Na Kabhi... Kahin Na Kahin," Ramesh tweeted on social media platform X. The remark underscores grow-



ing speculation about the participation of world leaders at the summit and reflects opposition scrutiny of Modi's international engagements. The G20 summit is a key global forum for addressing economic and geopolitical challenges, making Modi's presence or absence a matter of significant interest.

Relations between India and the US have become strained since the conflict five months ago. In August, the Trump administration imposed a 50 percent tariff on Indian exports, partly as a penalty related to India's purchase of Russian oil. Since then, trade negotiations have stalled without any breakthrough.

## Flight ops back to normal at Delhi airport

The flight operations started to normalize gradually after the issue was addressed, while the authorities were on their toes to minimize passenger inconvenience.

The snag caused massive delays in flight operations on Friday, inconveniencing passengers at the airport.

According to the authorities, upon detection of the issue in the IP-based AMSS system, an urgent review meeting was convened by Samir Kumar Sinha, Secretary, Ministry of Civil Aviation with Vipin Kumar, Chairman AAI, M. Suresh, Member (Air Navigation Services) AAI and senior officials, who had given immediate directions to identify and rectify the root cause of the problem.

All flight operations, including domestic and international, returned to normal on Saturday after massive delays were witnessed yesterday due to a snag with the Automatic Message Switching System (AMSS) that supports Air Traffic Control (ATC) with flight plan process.
