## Grand preparations for swearing-in ceremony

PM Modi holds key meeting with Amit Shah and JP Nadda  
Swearing-in ceremony in Bihar may take place on Nov 20



New Delhi: Following the landslide victory in the Bihar elections, the NDA constituents are

now brainstorming on forming the new government in the state. Meanwhile, grand preparations

for the swearing-in ceremony are underway.

PM Modi held a key meeting with Home Minister Amit Shah and BJP President JP Nadda at his residence on Sunday. According to sources, the meeting discussed holding the swearing-in ceremony in Bihar on November 20th.

Consequently, it is highly likely that the swearing-in ceremony for the new government in Bihar will be held on November 20th.

**Nitish Kumar to resign**  
**Paving the way for a new government**

The formal process for the

formation of the new government in Bihar will begin within the next 48 hours. A senior JDU official confirmed that Chief Minister Nitish Kumar will resign on Monday, paving the way for the formation of the new NDA government.

On Monday morning, Nitish Kumar will chair his government's final cabinet meeting.

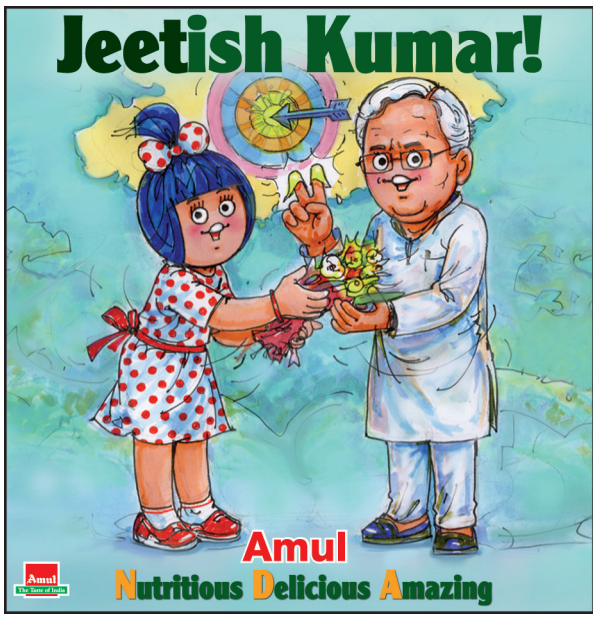
Immediately afterward, he will proceed to Raj Bhavan to submit his resignation to the Governor.

He will then attend a party meeting where the 85 newly elected JDU MLAs will decide on the future course of action. Following the JDU meeting, a separate NDA meeting will be held, the time and venue of which are yet to be finalized.

Three Names, Including Samrat, in the Race for Deputy CM

Efforts to form a new government in Bihar have intensified. The JDU has called a legislative party meeting on Monday, where Nitish Kumar will be elected as the legislative party leader. According to reports, 18 ministers may also be sworn in alongside Nitish Kumar. Meanwhile, the names of Samrat Chaudhary, Ramkripal Yadav, Mangal Pandey, and Nityanand Rai from the BJP are being discussed in the race for Deputy CM. Chirag Paswan's party, the LJP (R), will also get representation in Bihar government.

#### Five killed, 14 injured in truck and tempo collision in Jodhpur

Jodhpur: At least five people were killed and 14 others sustained injuries after a trailer truck and a tempo carrying devotees collided near Khari Beri village on NH-125 in Jodhpur on Saturday, officials said. The injured have been admitted to MDM Hospital in Jodhpur for treatment. Superintendent of MDM Hospital, Dr Vikas Kumar, said that three victims were brought dead to the hospital, while 14 injured patients are currently undergoing treatment. Among the injured, one has a serious abdominal injury, one has a chest injury, one has a head injury, and the rest are stable.

#### 4 killed, several injured in road accident in Budgam

Budgam (J&K): At least four people were killed and several others injured on Saturday evening when two vehicles collided in Central Kashmir's Budgam district, officials said. The collision was between a vehicle and a dumper truck. Today, Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah has expressed shock and sadness over the accident. The Chief Minister has instructed district officials to assist the affected families, provide prompt medical treatment to the injured, and conduct a thorough investigation into the cause of the accident.

#### Mumbai Police gets hoax call

Mumbai: A hoax call regarding a possible terrorist attack on the Naval Docks here, was received by the Mumbai Police on Sunday. Officials said the caller identified as Jahangir Sheikh informed the police control room that he had learnt about a planned attack on the Naval Docks from another person while he was in Hyderabad. Following the call, police and government agencies activated standard security protocols and conducted searches in and around the Naval Dock area. No suspicious activity, object or person was detected during the operation.

#### Punjab Police bust Pak-linked arms and drug network, five arrested

Amritsar (Punjab): The Punjab Police have busted a Pakistan-linked arms and drug network, arresting five people and seizing six pistols and more than 1 kg of heroin. According to the police, officers from the Amritsar Commissionerate acted on intelligence inputs. They recovered six sophisticated pistols, five of .30 bore and one Glock 9mm, along with 1 kg 10 grams of heroin. Early investigations show that the accused were in touch with handlers based in Pakistan through social media and drones, helping coordinate the smuggling and delivery of illegal weapons and drugs into Punjab.

## Congress to corner govt on SIR, calls leaders from 12 States to Delhi

New Delhi (UNI)

After a crushing defeat in Bihar, the Congress is now formulating a strategy to corner the government on the issue of SIR and has called leaders from 12 states involved in the SIR 2.0 voter list revision process to Delhi.

The party has held the Election Commission responsible for its poor performance in Bihar. The Congress aims to reach out to the public with a fresh strategy on SIR, prompting the leadership to summon senior party leaders from SIR-affected states for consultations in the capital. Leaders from Tamil Nadu, Kerala, West Bengal, Uttar

Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Puducherry, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, and Lakshadweep have been invited to Indira Bhavan on Tuesday, 18 November, at 10:30 am.

The meeting will include state in-charges, state presidents, leaders of the opposition, and co-in-charges. Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge will preside over the meeting, while Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi and Organisation General Secretary K.C. Venugopal will also be present.

According to party sources, the Congress plans to increase its outreach on

the issue of voter list revision. The central leadership will instruct state units to intensify their activities on the ground.

Of the 12 SIR 2.0 states, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, West Bengal, and Puducherry will go to assembly polls in 2026. Following its defeat in Bihar, the Congress is determined not to leave any gaps in preparation in these key states. Party sources added that the INDIA bloc is preparing for a strong protest on SIR during the upcoming Lok Sabha session. The Congress also plans to hold a major rally at Delhi's Ramlila Maidan in the last week of November to highlight issues related to the voter list revision.

## Five killed after car collides with tractor in Gwalior



Gwalior: At least five people lost their lives early Sunday morning when a car collided with a tractor near Malwa College in Maharajpura, Gwalior, police said.

City Superintendent of Police (CSP) Hina Khan stated that a car travelling from Dabra collided with a tractor near Malwa College in Maharajpura, resulting in the death of

all passengers.

The bodies of the victims have been sent for post-mortem examination at the district hospital. Preliminary reports indicate that some of the deceased belong to the Rajawat family from Adityapuram, while verification of the others is ongoing.

Hina Khan said, this morning, between 6:00 and 6:30 a.m., the control room received information that an accident had occurred on the highway in front of Malwa College, involving a collision between a car and a tractor. Police immediately rushed to the scene, and everyone arrived to verify the incident.

A white car carrying five boys was coming from the Dabra side of the highway when it collided with a tractor from behind.

### Three Naxalites killed in encounter

Sukma: Three Naxalities were killed in a fierce encounter with the security forces in the dense forests of Karigundam, located between Chintagufa and Bheji police station areas in Sukma district, Chhattisgarh.

According to reports, based on credible intelligence, a joint team comprising the police, District Reserve Guard (DRG), and Special Task Force (STF) launched an operation against the Naxalites.

Sources said that the team had received information about a Naxalite group active in the Karigundam forests. Acting on this intelligence, the joint teams of police, DRG, and STF began a cordon-and-search operation.

## Haryana doctor detained

After counter intelligence Kashmir raids in Anantnag

A woman doctor from Haryana, currently posted at a government medical college in south Kashmir, has been detained for questioning after the police claimed to have found links to a "white-collar" terror network. Officials say this network stretches across Jammu and Kashmir, Haryana and even New Delhi. The detained doctor has been identified as Dr Priyanka Sharma from Rohatki district in Haryana, who has been working at GMC Anantnag.

A mobile phone was seized for forensic analysis, said top intelligence sources.

During the search, officials found that a woman doctor from Haryana was living at the accused doctor's house as a tenant. Her verification process is on to map the module and its links, said sources.

Bilal Ahmad Wani, a dry-fruit seller, was also picked up for questioning along with his son, who attempted self-immolation in Qazigund. He was rushed to GMC Anantnag with burns, where he remains in custody, according to police.

### Key conspirator Amir Rashid Ali in Delhi blast case arrested



In a significant breakthrough, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) has arrested a crucial conspirator linked to the recent car bomb blast near Delhi's Red Fort. The agency apprehended Amir Rashid Ali, a Kashmiri resident, in the national capital after intensive investigations and a large-scale search operation. Investigations revealed that Amir Rashid Ali had helped the alleged suicide bomber, Umar Un Nabi, by facilitating the purchase of the car used to carry out the deadly vehicle-borne Improvised Explosive Device (IED) attack.
