
On Monday morning, Nitish Kumar will chair his government's final cabinet meeting.

### 18 possible NDA ministers in Bihar's new govt


Three Names, Including Samrat, in the Race for Deputy CM

## Congress to corner govt on SIR, calls leaders from 12 States to Delhi

New Delhi (UNI)

After a crushing defeat in Bihar, the Congress is now formulating a strategy to corner the government on the issue of SIR and has called leaders from 12 states involved in the SIR 2.0 voter list revision process to Delhi.

The party has held the Election Commission responsible for its poor performance in Bihar. The Congress aims to reach out to the public with a fresh strategy on SIR, prompting the leadership to summon senior party leaders from SIR-affected states for consultations in the capital. Leaders from Tamil Nadu, Kerala, West Bengal, Uttar

Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Puducherry, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, and Lakshadweep have been invited to Indira Bhawan on Tuesday, 18 November, at 10:30 am.

The meeting will include state in-charges, state presidents, leaders of the opposition, and co-in-charges. Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge will preside over the meeting, while Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi and Organisation General Secretary K.C. Venugopal will also be present.

According to party sources, the Congress plans to increase its outreach on

the issue of voter list revision. The central leadership will instruct state units to intensify their activities on the ground.

Of the 12 SIR 2.0 states, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, West Bengal, and Puducherry will go to assembly polls in 2026. Following its defeat in Bihar, the Congress is determined not to leave any gaps in preparation in these key states. Party sources added that the INDIA bloc is preparing for a strong protest on SIR during the upcoming Lok Sabha session. The Congress also plans to hold a major rally at Delhi's Ramlila Maidan in the last week of November to highlight issues related to the voter list revision.

The bodies of the victims have been sent for post-mortem examination at the district hospital. Preliminary reports indicate that some of the deceased belong to the Rajawat family from Adityapuram, while verification of the others is ongoing.

### Three Naxalites killed in encounter

Sukma: Three Naxalites were killed in a fierce encounter with the security forces in the dense forests of Karigundam, located between Chintagufa and Bheji police station areas in Sukma district, Chhattisgarh.

According to reports, based on credible intelligence, a joint team comprising the police, District Reserve Guard (DRG), and Special Task Force (STF) launched an operation against the Naxalites.

Sources said that the team had received information about a Naxalite group active in the Karigundam forests. Acting on this intelligence, the joint teams of police, DRG, and STF began a cordon-and-search operation.

## Haryana doctor detained

After counter intelligence Kashmir raids in Anantnag

A woman doctor from Haryana, currently posted at a government medical college in south Kashmir, has been detained for questioning after the police claimed to have found links to a "white-collar" terror network. Officials say this network stretches across Jammu and Kashmir, Haryana and even New Delhi. The detained doctor has been identified as Dr Priyanka Sharma from Rohtak district in Haryana, who has been working at GMC Anantnag.

A mobile phone was seized for forensic analysis, said top intelligence sources.

During the search, officials found that a woman doctor from Haryana was living at the accused doctor's house as a tenant. Her verification process is on to map the module and its links, said sources.

Bilal Ahmad Wani, a dry-fruit seller, was also picked up for questioning along with his son, who attempted self-immolation in Qazigund. He was rushed to GMC Anantnag with burns, where he remains in custody, according to police.

### Key conspirator Amir Rashid Ali in Delhi blast case arrested



In a significant breakthrough, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) has arrested a crucial conspirator linked to the recent car bomb blast near Delhi's Red Fort. The agency apprehended Amir Rashid Ali, a Kashmiri resident, in the national capital after intensive investigations and a large-scale search operation. Investigations revealed that Amir Rashid Ali had helped the alleged suicide bomber, Umar Un Nabi, by facilitating the purchase of the car used to carry out the deadly vehicle-borne Improvised Explosive Device (IED) attack.
