

New twist in case of suspicious death of MBBS student at GRMC

Made last call to his girlfriend before his death, shocking revelation from CDR

Gwalior: A new twist has emerged in the case of the suspicious death of an MBBS student at Gajra Raja Medical College (GRMC). According to reports, first-year student Yashraj Uikey made his last call to his girlfriend before his death. This information has been revealed in the CDR (Call Detail Record).

Just two minutes before his death, the student spoke to a fellow first-year MBBS student at the college, who is said to be his girlfriend. According to the CDR, Yashraj made maximum calls to this student after his family. Chats, notes, and call recordings on his mobile phone could reveal significant revelations in this case. A few days ago, Uikey died under suspicious circumstances after falling from the roof of the medical college hostel. Yashraj Uike, a 21-year-old resident of Ghadadongri in Ranipur, Betul district,



had enrolled at Gajra Raja Medical College this year.

Ravishankar Shukla lived on the first floor of the Junior Boys Hostel. His roommate Praveen Sahariya, a resident of Guna, was in the room at around 9.45 pm on Monday night, and

Yashraj was in the open area outside the room. Then suddenly he fell from the second floor. Hearing the sound of falling, the guard ran and saw Yashraj lying on the ground. The guard informed the hostel warden and other students. Everyone took the student to

the trauma centre of Jayarogya Hospital, where he died during treatment.

Father says: He was a sincere, soft-spoken boy

Yashraj's father, Pancham Uike, rushed from Betul to Gwalior after learning of the incident, only to be informed that his son had passed away.

He described Yashraj as a sincere, soft-spoken boy with no disputes or enemies. "He was always focused on studies. When he didn't call that day, I thought he was busy," he said. Police faced criticism for not involving forensic experts on the first day. Two days later, senior forensic scientist Akhilesh Bhargav and ASP Vidita Dagar inspected the site. Their assessment suggested suicide, not an accidental fall. This led investigators to conduct a detailed scene recreation five days later.

Process to shift oxygen plant begins in district hospital



Guna: The process of shifting the 1000 LPM PSA (Pressure Swing Adsorption) oxygen production plant installed at the District Hospital to a new location is underway. Focus on boosting school attendance



Datia: Under the guidance of Collector Swapnil Wankhade, a "Samvad Program" is underway in Datia district to prevent child labour, re-

connect children with education, and improve school attendance. A joint team from the Child Welfare Committee, Labor Department,

Education Department, and SJPU visited Government Primary School, Prakash Nagar, and New Government Primary School, Railway Station.

Parents were encouraged to involve children in sports and creative activities for holistic development. Schools were advised to provide such activities and ensure proper use of complaint boxes. Parents pledged regular attendance, while school authorities promised to improve facilities. The next session will be held during the parent-teacher meeting.

Clash over liquor discount turns fatal



Vidisha: In Devkhajuri, under the Kararia police station area, a violent clash erupted between local youths and liquor shop employees over a liquor discount. What began as a minor argument quickly esca-

lated into a fierce fight, leaving several people injured on both sides. Among them, Rajkumar Raghuvanshi, Devendra Raghuvanshi, and Durgesh Raghuvanshi of Tajkhajuri sustained serious in-

juries. The three were admitted to the district hospital late at night. Due to their critical condition, they were referred to the medical college, where Rajkumar succumbed to his injuries during treatment. Following his death, the police are preparing to add a charge of murder to the case.

According to the Superintendent of Police, the groups may have had prior disputes, but the latest confrontation was triggered by a disagreement over selling liquor at a reduced rate. Injured victim Durgesh Raghuvanshi stated that Rajkumar runs a shop in Devkhajuri, and the conflict reignited when a liquor shop employee visited to buy cigarettes. When Rajkumar arrived to resolve the matter, he was attacked, leading to the fatal incident.

Loading vehicle overturns, driver injured

Morena: A loading vehicle carrying buffaloes overturned today in the Noorabad police station area of Morena district, injuring the driver and the buffaloes. The injured driver has been admitted to the district hospital.

According to police sources, the accident occurred at village Karuna Mod, located on National Highway 44 in the Noorabad police station area. The vehicle, loaded with buffaloes, was heading from Morena to Gwalior this morning when it lost control at village Karuna Mod, hit a divider, and overturned, seriously injuring the driver. The buffaloes in the vehicle were also injured in the accident.

The overturning of the loading vehicle caused a traffic jam on the highway, disrupting traffic for more than half an hour. Police managed to clear the jam after considerable effort.

MP Transco energizes 50 MVA power transformer

Datia: On the instructions of Energy Minister Pradyuman Singh Tomar, Madhya Pradesh Power Transmission Company (MP Transco) has strengthened the transmission system in Datia district by installing and energizing an additional 50 MVA power transformer at the 132 kV Bhandar substation. Tomar stated that this will provide an additional power transformer to the substation and ensure uninterrupted and quality electricity for agricultural electricity consumers in the Bhandar area of Datia district for irrigation purposes during the Rabi season. With the successful energization of this transformer, the substation's capacity has increased from 63 MVA to 113

MVA. **Increased in transmission capacity:** Rajiv Totla, Superintending Engineer, MP Transco, stated that this will benefit domestic and agricultural electricity consumers in the Pichaur, Dabra, Sitapur, Dagrai, Bhandar, Rajghat, and Datia areas, as well as the 33 kV industrial feeder originating from this substation. In Datia district, MP Transco transmits electricity through five extra-high-tension substations, including the 132 kV Bhandar substation. This includes the 220 kV Datia substation and the 132 kV Datia, Sendhwa, and Indargarh substations, with a total transformation capacity of 796 MVA. has increased to 846 MVA.
