## 41 acres of illegal poppy farms destroyed in Manipur

Imphal: Security Forces, in coordination with the Manipur Police, Forest Department, and the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), carried out a series of intensified anti-narcotics and law-enforcement operations across Manipur yesterday, targeting illegal poppy cultivation networks. In a significant operation in the hill ranges of Kotlen village under Kangpokpi Police Station, authorities destroyed approximately 41 acres of illicit poppy plantations. During the raid, teams also dismantled 23 makeshift huts and seized cultivation materials including nine bags of fertilizers, eleven packets of herbicides, four bags of salt, and other tools.

## KMB-6 collaterals to open on Dec 14

Kochi: The Collaterals programme of the sixth Kochi-Muziris Biennale (KMB-6) will open on December 14, featuring nine institutes showcasing a wide spectrum of contemporary art practices aligned with the festival's central curatorial theme. The 110-day Biennale, South Asia's largest contemporary art event, begins on December 12 and runs until March 31, 2026. Announcing the details, the Kochi Biennale Foundation (KBF) said the collateral exhibitions spread across Fort Kochi and Mättancherry were selected through an open call. KBF Director of Programmes Mario D'Souza said that the Collaterals have been "reimagined" for the sixth edition, with the jury shortlisting nine projects from over 150 submissions.

## Punjab: Man wanted in murder case killed in encounter

Amritsar (Punjab): A criminal accused of killing a grocery store owner in Amritsar was killed in an encounter with the Police on Monday. DIG Border Range, Amritsar, Sandeep Goel, said that the wanted criminal Rajan alias Billa was injured in the exchange of fire, following which he was overpowered. "We shifted him to the hospital where he died." Sharing details on the case, on 16th Nov, a man - identified as Sardar Manjit Singh was killed by two bike-borne masked men under Khilchian PS area. Since that day, SSP Suhail Mir had been working on this case along with his team.

## Incessant rainfall triggers waterlogging in residential areas in Thoothukudi

Thoothukudi: Continuous rainfall over the past two days has led to widespread waterlogging across several suburban parts of the Thoothukudi district, severely impacting daily life for residents. Multiple neighbourhoods, housing colonies, and narrow streets have been inundated, with rainwater entering residential areas and disrupting normal movement. The stagnant water has created significant challenges for office-goers, schoolchildren, and senior citizens.

## Hyderabad doctor dies by suicide after US visa rejection

Hyderabad: A 39-year-old doctor was found dead, allegedly by suicide, at her flat in Padma Rao Nagar in Hyderabad, police said on Monday. The woman's application for a US visa had been rejected, allegedly prompting her to take the extreme step, the Chikalguda police said. The deceased Dr Kaku Rohini died on Thursday night at the Dharani Surya Sai Apartment where she was staying while preparing for a PG Residency in the US. Police said that, as per a report filed by her mother, Dr Rohini was preparing for the medical PG exam and had secured a PG Residency Seat in the US.

## Delhi Police summon three more teachers in Class 10 student suicide case

New Delhi: Delhi Police on Monday summoned three more teachers for questioning in connection with the suicide of a 16-year-old Class 10 student at Rajendra Place Metro Station. Police questioned two other teachers on Sunday, while some students have also been examined as part of the investigation.

## Guv Bose visits Indo-Bangladesh border

## Amid reports of 'Reverse Migration' during SIR drive

## Kolkata (UNI)

Taking cognisance of media reports about a "reverse migration" of hundreds of alleged illegal immigrants from Bangladesh following the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, West Bengal Governor CV Ananda Bose on Monday visited the BSF border outpost at Swarupnagar in North 24 Parganas to assess the situation firsthand.

Bose reached Hakimpura in Swarupnagar around 5.15 pm and interacted extensively with local residents and those staying in temporary shelters before speaking with security personnel.

"Is there so much security for this 'reverse migration'?" he asked BSF officials while reviewing the deployment.

His visit came when thousands reportedly gathered near the Hakimpura border point in Swarupnagar, seeking passage back to Bangladesh.

Although there has been no official statement, BSF sources indicate



that many of those assembled may have entered India illegally and now fear that the SIR process could expose their identities.

Earlier, speaking to reporters in Kolkata, Bose said, "Multiple interpretations are being made of media

reports of illegal Bangladeshi immigrants trying to return after the SIR began in the state. I want to see the ground situation with my own eyes so that I can form an opinion myself."

Calling the SIR a "crucial and im-

portant" exercise of the Election Commission of India, he added, "If there are any grievances, I believe the EC will address them. I hope everything goes well. All's well that ends well."

Addressing concerns surrounding the SIR drive, the Governor had said in a program yesterday that there was "no need to panic," adding, "The Election Commission is strong enough and has a balanced outlook. All issues will be examined properly and solutions will be found. What is required is free and fair elections in this country."

Responding cautiously to Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's allegations about deaths and excessive workload among Booth Level Officers (BLOs), Bose had said, "It is better to avoid immediate reactions. What the chief minister is saying will be closely examined. We need a Himsa-Mukta Bengal (violence-free Bengal) and a Bhrastachar-Mukta Bengal (corruption-free Bengal)."

## Kiren Rijiju leads delegation to return Lord Buddha's sacred relics from Bhutan

New Delhi: Union Minister for Parliamentary and Minority Affairs, Kiren Rijiju, on Monday departed for Bhutan to lead the delegation overseeing the return of Lord Buddha's sacred relics to India, following their recent public exhibition in the neighbouring country.

Sharing the update on social media platform X, Rijiju wrote, "Leaving for the Kingdom of Bhutan to lead the 'Delegation for the Return of Sacred Relics of Lord Buddha' (enshrined at the National Museum in New Delhi), which was brought to Bhutan for public exposition."

The sacred relics will be brought back to India on the following day, 25th November, 2025.

The extension underscores the deep cultural and spiritual bonds between India and Bhutan and reflects the immense public reverence the exposition has received from the people of Bhutan.

## Hate speech FIR registered against BJP leader Ajay Shyam

## Shimla (UNI)

Himachal Pradesh Police have formally registered an FIR against BJP leader Ajay Shyam in an alleged hate speech case that has generated significant public concern.

The FIR (No. 0067/2025), lodged at Police Station Kumarsain on November 22, follows a detailed written complaint submitted by Shimla resident Atul Sharma.

Shyam, who contested the 2022 Assembly election from Kumarsain on a BJP ticket, has been booked under Sections 299, 352, 353(1)(c), and 196(1) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sahita (BNS), 2023, provisions dealing with deliberate religious insult, promotion of communal enmity, provo-

cation likely to disturb public order, and assertions prejudicial to national integration.



The alleged incident took place on November 17 at Kyara in Theog, where Shyam addressed a gathering in the presence of school children.

The FIR reproduces portions of the speech that the complainant alleges constituted hate speech, blasphemy, and an attempt to undermine Hindu/Sanatani religious traditions.

In his extensive written complaint, Sharma termed the situation a "cultural emergency," alleging deliberate provocation and historical distortion intended to foment communal disharmony.

## DM, SSP to address every citizen's complaint promptly: CM Yogi

## Lucknow (UNI)

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Monday instructed all District Magistrates and Senior Superintendents of Police to ensure that grievances are heard and addressed at the district level itself.

He emphasised that officers must ensure the timely redressal of complaints across all departments.

The instructions were given during a Janata Darshan at his official residence here.

More than 52 individuals from various districts across Uttar Pradesh attended the event to present their grievances. The Chief Minister personally interacted with each complainant, listened to their concerns, and issued directions to en-



sure a prompt resolution.

The complaints presented during the Janata Darshan included issues related to financial assistance, illegal

encroachments, electricity supply, education, policing matters, and other public concerns.

## Four minors among 6 of family ill after meal cooked with 'acid'

Kolkata: Six members of a silversmith's family, including four minors, were taken critically ill in West Medinipur district after consuming a day meal that was accidentally cooked with acid instead of water, a district health official said.

All six were initially admitted to the Ghatal Super Speciality Hospital but were later shifted to the SSKM Hospital in Kolkata as their condition deteriorated.

The incident occurred at Ratneswarbati village under the Ghatal block on Sunday noon when a relative, who had come to visit the family of silversmith Santhu Sanyasi, prepared the meal. Unaware that a container held acid used for melting silver, she reportedly used it in place of water while cooking rice.

Soon after eating, all six members began vomiting and suffering from upset stomach fell critically ill.

Rescuers backed by State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) and police saved 17 tourists while the injured were admitted to two hospitals. The accident occurred near Kunjapuri temple in the Narendranagar hills of Tehri district. According to information shared by the District Disaster Management Department, all 29 passengers aboard the bus were tourists from Gujarat.

## India, Canada have considerable scope for future collaboration: Piyush Goyal

## New Delhi (UNI)

India sees considerable scope for collaboration with Canada in critical minerals, mineral processing technologies, clean energy, nuclear energy and supply-chain diversification, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said here on Monday. Addressing the Indo-Canadian Business Chamber the Minister proposed a five-pronged approach to further strengthen India-Canada relations.

He emphasised the need to convert dialogue into delivery through actionable outcomes, sectoral roadmaps and measurable progress and called for revitalising the CEO Forum to enhance business-to-business partnerships.

He said India offers strong advantages in emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence, quantum



computing, machine learning and next-generation data centres, supported by the world's largest annual pool of STEM graduates.

Pointing out that India and Canada are natural allies whose comple-

mentary strengths create significant opportunities for businesses and investors in both countries, he said the India-Canada partnership continues to be grounded in mutual trust, democratic values and a shared commitment to development.

He emphasised that the bilateral relationship remains strong and stable, with steadily growing engagement across trade, investment and emerging sectors.

Referring to the recent meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney during the G20 Summit, Goyal highlighted that both leaders agreed to begin negotiations for a high-ambition Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) and double bilateral trade by 2030.

CEPA reflects the trust between the two countries, strengthens in-

vestor confidence and provides a robust framework for addressing issues based on mutual respect.

Goyal underlined that India's national power grid of 500 GW, including 250 GW of clean energy capacity, provides the resilience required for AI-driven infrastructure.

India's ambition to double clean energy capacity to 500 GW by 2030 positions the country as a trusted and sustainable partner
