She would arrive from Mandya in Karnataka and after offering darshan at the Sripuram Golden Temple she would leave for Rashtrapati Nilayam, Bolarum, Secunderabad, for a winter sojourn.

Two killed in massive fire breaks out in **Dhanbad House**

Dhanbad: A devastating fire broke out late on Monday night at Chintamani Niwas in Vikas Nagar under the Saraidhela police station area of Dhanbad district, claiming the lives of two people and leaving six others severely injured. The deceased have been identified as 70-year-old Chinta Devi and her 18-yearold grandson Prashant Kumar alias Golu. Police said that Golu had arrived from Patna to his grandmother's house around 15 days ago. According to preliminary information, about 15 people were present in the threestorey house at the time of the incident. Eight people were sleeping on the first floor, three on the second floor and four on the third floor.

Four killed in SUV crash on Agra-**Lucknow Expressway** in UP's Unnao

Unnao: Four people were killed in a horrific road accident on the Agra–Lucknow Expressway early today morning after the tyre of their SUV burst, causing the vehicle to lose control and crash into the divider. The accident occurred around 5 am near Kilometre Number 241 in the Bangarmau area. The victims were travelling in an SUV from Ghaziabad towards Lucknow when the front tyre reportedly burst at a speed of over 100 kmph. The vehicle went out of control and rammed into the divider, resulting in severe damage to its front portion. The collision led to a loud explosion, drawing the attention of people nearby. Police reached the spot soon after receiving the information and sent the bodies for post-mortem examination.

Road blockade in **Bokaro** against murder

Bokaro: Protests erupted in Bokaro on Tuesday after the alleged abduction and murder of a resident belonging to the Harla police station area. Agitated lo-cals blocked the road at Naya Mor, disrupting traffic and demanding strict action against those responsible for the crime. Police have so far arrested six suspects following the registration of the case in which the accused were named, police said. Meanwhile, the arrest of Vinod Kumar, one of the arretsed, has sparked controversy, with his wife submitting a written application to the district administration claiming that her husband is innocent. She alleged that Vinod has been deliberately implicated in the case under a political conspiracy. Describing him as a social worker, she asserted that he has no involvement in the murder.

Son arrested for killing parents, dumping bodies into Gomti

Jaunpur: A local youth allegedly murdered his parents and dumped their bodies into the Gomti river in an atempt to destroy evidence, police said on Tuesday

The crime came to light on Mon-day evening after the accused, who had been missing since the incident, was arrested by the police and confessed during interrogation.

The police identified the suspect as Ambesh Kumar, a resident of Ahmadpur Chhavani Gauriyana village. His father, Shyam Bahadur, was a retired railway loco pilot. Police said Ambesh was arrested near his village on Monday. During initial questioning, Ambesh was evasive, but after sustained interrogation, he broke down and confessed to killing his parents on December 8.

Row over symbolic 'purification ritual' carried out by IUML workers

A symbolic "purification ritual" carried out by Indian union Muslim League (IUML) workers at the Changaroth gram panchayat office after the Congress-led United Democratic Front (UDF) wrested control from the CPI(M)- led Left Democratic Front (LDF) has sparked a controversy over alleged caste discrimination, on Tuesday.

IUML workers, part of the UDF, cleaned the panchayat premises on December 13 by brooming and spraying dung water, after winning 17 of the 20 wards in the recent local body elections. The visuals showing party flags during the act, went viral on social media on Tuesday.

The LDF won one ward, while the remaining two were secured by the Welfare Party of India (WPI). The swearing-in ceremony of the new panchayat president is scheduled on December 21. The incident drew protests from DYFI, the youth wing of the CPI(M), and the Pattikajathi

Kshema Samithi (PKS), who organized separate marches to the panchayat office alleging caste discrimi

Protesters claimed that dung mixed water was sprayed as part of "purification ritual", insulting former panchayat president Unni Vengeri, who belongs to the Schedule Caste (SC) community. Police stopped the

protestors at the gate. DYFI leaders alleged that such rit uals were not conducted in any other panchayats, including nearby Perambra and Chakkitupara, where the UDF had earlier taken control from the LDF. They claimed the act target ed a Dalit leader and reflected an up per-caste feudal mindset. DYFI and PKS demanded strict legal actions against the IUML workers.

Responding to the allegations, IUML Changaroth unit President A Nazir said the cleaning was symbolic and aimed at "sweeping away corrup-tion", from the LDF administration, not at any individual or community.

Chennai: In a tragic accident, four suffered serious injuries when a speeding cattle fodder laden lorry collided with multiple vehicles on the Thoppur Ghat Road in Dharma-puri district of Tamil Nadu today.

Police said the ill-fated lorry was heading for Namakkal district from Maharashtra when the accident occurred after the driver lost control of the vehicle and collided with atleast four vehicles on the accident-prone

The lorry first collided with a bike and then hit a parcel van and car and another van killing four people, including the lorry driver, on the spot.

12 detained as CIK conducts valleywide raids in terror network case

Jammu and Kashmir Police's Counter Intelligence Kashmir (CIK) Tuesday detained 12 suspects for questioning during the raids that were conducted at multiple locations across the Kashmir Valley in connection with a terror-related case, officials said.

The searches targeted a suspected

terror-support network allegedly operating under the guise of social ac-

Police said searches were carried out at 12 locations across seven districts- Srinagar, Baramulla, Anant-Pulwama, Kupwara, Budgam Shopian- after search warrants were obtained in case registered in 2023 under Sections 153-A and 505 IPC, and Sections 13 and 18 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act

at Police Station CIK. According to police, the case stems from credible intelligence inputs indicating that certain individuals in Jammu & Kashmir were exploiting platforms linked to mass media, social media, human rights advocacy, environmental causes and women empowerment as a cover to carry out activities gravely prejudicial to the sovereignty, integrity and security of India.

Poor air grips Mumbai, raising health concerns

Mumbai: Mumbai woke up to hazy skies on Tuesday morning as air quality across the city continued to remain in the poor category of monitoring platform, despite a forecast of clear and comfortable winter weather.

A layer of smog was visible over several parts of the city shortly after daybreak, leading to reduced visibility and a noticeable acrid smell in many areas. Early morning commuters, walkers and schoolchildren reported discomfort, particularly in low-lying and high-traffic zones.

According to data from air quality monitoring platform AQI.in, Mumbai's overall Air Quality Index (AQI) stood at 163 during the early hours, placing it firmly in the 'poor' category. While this marked a marginal improvement compared to the severe pollution levels recorded in late November, experts cautioned that the air quality remains unhealthy, especially for children, senior citizens and those with respiratory or cardiac ailments.

Another firm booked in UP's Rampur for illegal sale of codeine syrup

Rampur (UNI)

One more firm in the city has come under the scanner for the illegal sale of codeine-based cough syrup. Legal action is set to be initiated after the firm failed to provide records of the purchase and sale of the syrup. The Drug Inspector has submitted a complaint at the City Kotwali police station, sources said on Tuesday.

The state government has taken a tough stand against firms involved in the illegal trade of codeine-based syrup. Across Uttar Pradesh, as many as 298 firms have been found involved in the illegal purchase and sale of codeine syrup. Around half-a-dozen of these firms are from Rampur district and are currently under investigation by the Drugs Department.

Information about these firms was received from Ghaziabad, where Drugs Department officials conducted raids at several wholesale traders. During the raids, it was revealed that a large quantity of codeine syrup had been purchased from Ghaziabad by about six firms from Rampur, but no sales records

were maintained by them. Notices were issued to all firms seeking explanations. Drug Inspector Mukesh Kumar said that a notice was also sent to Lata Pharma-ceutical, located in Rajdwara locality of the city. The firm failed to submit records related to the purchase and sale of codeine-based syrup. The proprietor of the firm is Harsh Agrawal. Following this, a complaint has been filed at City Kotwali for legal action.

Police personnel were deployed around the office, and surrounding ar eas were secured as a precaution Bomb disposal and canine squads were called in to inspect the premises and confirm there was no real threat.
