


Patwari urges MP Govt to focus on development

Bhopal: Madhya Pradesh Congress Committee president Jeetu Patwari on Saturday called upon the state government and to demonstrate seriousness towards genuine development, reacting to the inauguration of the new Metro project in Bhopal.

Patwari said the Congress party has always supported the expansion of urban transport systems and infrastructure development. He pointed out that the Metro projects for major cities such as Bhopal and Indore were conceived during the tenure of the Congress government and formally initiated under the leadership of former chief minister Kamal Nath.

He criticised what he described as a politics of symbolism, stating that development cannot be achieved merely through ceremonial coconut-breaking, photo op-



portunities or attempts to claim credit. According to him, meaningful urban growth requires well-planned and effectively implemented policies rather than head-

line-grabbing events.

The PCC chief emphasised the need for the state government to work seriously on forthcoming master plans for Bhopal, Indore and other major cities, and to ensure their proper execution on the ground. He said the foundations of development laid by the previous Congress government must be carried forward with honesty and commitment by the present BJP dispensation.

Patwari asserted that the people of Madhya Pradesh are not interested in showmanship but expect tangible development, improved civic amenities and better quality of life. He added that the Congress would continue to seek accountability from the government on issues related to transparency, public welfare and the overall development of the state.

CM Dr Mohan Yadav orders crackdown on Blackmailing Youtubers

Bhopal: Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav has directed DGP Kailash Makwana to initiate strict legal action against Youtubers using their platforms for extortion and harassment. The move follows rising complaints of digital creators targeting government officials, politicians, and private citizens to blackmail them.

Citing the rigorous policing style of former IPS officer G. Jannardhan, the CM emphasized that such cyber-crimes require a firm hand to protect public interests. Police departments are now set to monitor digital platforms closely, ensuring that "freedom of expression" is not used as a shield for criminal coercion.

Former CM Kamal Nath celebrates Bhopal Metro launch

Bhopal: As the capital city officially launched its much-awaited Metro services today, former Union Minister and former Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh, Kamal Nath, took to social media to congratulate the citizens and reflect on the project's journey.

In a heartfelt tweet, Nath expressed his immense satisfaction, stating, "Heartiest congratulations to all Bhopal residents on the launch of the Metro train. I am delighted that the initiative I took as a Union Minister and the project for which I laid the foundation stone as Chief Minister is taking shape today."

Nath said in his tweet that as a CM of MP I have performed the 'Bhoomi Pujan' for the project in



September 2019, emphasized his hope that residents would fully utilize this modern facility to ease urban commuting.

'Wash on Wheels' empowers rural youth



Bhopal: The "Wash on Wheels" initiative, launched under the Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) in Fanda Janpad Panchayat, is bringing positive change in both rural sanitation and youth livelihoods.

hoods. Started a few months ago, the programme aims to provide accessible sanitation services in villages while creating self-employment opportunities for young people.

Under the initiative, local youth such as Ravi Shraavan, Vishesh Nihoria, Brajesh Khare and Vijay from Bagroda village were selected as sanitation partners. After receiving proper training and equipment, they began offering door-to-door toilet cleaning, sanitation services and awareness programmes in rural areas.

Sanitation partner Ravi Shraavan shared that he earlier struggled financially, but now earns between Rs 1,000 and 1,500 daily, becoming self-reliant and an inspiration for other youth.

Asha Rai, an employee of Fanda Janpad Panchayat, said that 110 people have registered under the initiative so far, with 87 tasks successfully completed. Efforts are underway to expand the programme by involving all Gram Panchayats in the district.

Body of missing grocery store owner found on railway track

Bhopal: The body of a missing grocery store owner has been found on the Bhanpur railway track in the city. He had left his home two days earlier

without informing anyone. His family found his body on the railway track on Saturday morning during their search. The police have registered a case and started investigation.

According to the police, Mohan Singh Lodhi (55), son of Bittulal, a resident of Khamkheda, Chhola Mandir police station area, ran a grocery store. He had three daughters and one son. He left home on Thursday evening without telling anyone and did not return. After searching extensively and failing to find him, a missing person report was filed at the police station.

The deceased's brother, Laxman Verma, said that they saw a crowd near the Bhanpur bridge on Saturday morning. When they reached the spot, they found a body lying by the side of the track.

Upon checking, they identified the body as that of their brother, Mohan. The police stated that no suicide note was found. The case is being investigated from all angles.

Contractor ends life after Rs 30 lakh gaming loss

Bhopal: In a tragic reminder of the devastating impact of digital addiction, a 32-year-old contractor, Shivan Gupta, died by suicide in the Ayodhya Nagar area after losing a staggering Rs 30 lakh in an online game called 'Aviator'. The incident came to light when Shivan was found in his home. A recovered suicide note revealed a harrowing tale of financial ruin. Driven by addiction, Shivan had borrowed massive sums from various lenders to fund his bets. As the losses mounted, the crushing pressure from creditors reportedly pushed him into severe clinical depression. Ironically, while his family was busy searching for a bride to begin a new chapter of his life, they remained completely unaware of the digital quicksand he was sinking into.

Doctor's selfless act saves woman, newborn

Bhopal: An inspiring example of medical dedication was seen in Bhopal when Dr. Parth Sharma of Sanjeevani Clinic, Bhanpur Malikheda, placed patient welfare above all else. A pregnant woman from Malikheda, whose due date was in January, suddenly developed severe labour pains nearly a month early. On receiving information from local ANM Rani Yadav, Dr. Sharma immediately rushed to the woman's home in his personal vehicle and provided initial medical care. Recognising the seriousness of her condition and not waiting for an ambulance, he promptly took her to a higher-level health facility in his own vehicle.

Hindu outfit responds to Muslim body's drive against western culture

Bhopal: Political and social debate over Indian culture versus Western influence has intensified following a recent protest by the All India Muslim Tyohar Committee. Reacting to the campaign, the Hindu Festival Committee issued a strong statement, asserting that Indian culture is not merely a subject for speeches but a way of life that must be genuinely practiced. Committee president Chandrashekhar Tiwari said cultural values should be reflected in daily conduct, not just expressed on public platforms.

Earlier, the All India Muslim Tyohar Committee launched a "Public Awareness Campaign against Western Civilization" from Bhopal with the stated aim of preserving Indian culture and traditional values. Ad-

ressing the gathering, committee patron Shamsul Hasan said the movement would be expanded nationwide. He expressed concern over what he termed the growing influence of obscenity and nudity in the name of Western culture, warning of its adverse impact on society, especially on women and children.

Hasan emphasized that safeguarding moral and social values is a collective responsibility. The committee said it would monitor events that promote indecency and register peaceful protests.

A demonstration was held in the Itwara area, where speakers clarified that the campaign targets indecent practices, not any community or festival, and seeks adherence to Indian traditions.
