**PM Modi extends greetings to Sashastra Seema Bal on Raising Day**

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday extended his greetings to the personnel of the Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) on the occasion of its Raising Day. In a post on social media, PM Modi said, "SSB's unwavering dedication reflects the highest traditions of service. Their sense of duty remains a strong pillar of our nation's safety." The SSB is a border guarding force responsible for guarding India's borders with Nepal and Bhutan. The force plays a crucial role in maintaining the country's security and has been working tirelessly to protect the nation's interests. PM Modi praised the SSB for its dedication and vigilance, saying, "From challenging terrains to demanding operational conditions, the SSB stands ever vigilant."

**NIA arrests two Maoist accused in Gawade murder case**

New Delhi: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has arrested two more absconders in Maharashtra's Dinesh Pusu Gawade murder case. The wanted accused, both members of the banned CPI (Maoist) terrorist organisation, have been identified as Raghu alias Pratap alias Irpa alias Muddella alias Sailu of district Nizamabad, Telangana, and Shankar Mahaka of district Gadchiroli, Maharashtra. Dinesh Pusu Gawade was abducted and brutally murdered by CPI (Maoist) members in November 2023 in Gadchiroli on suspicion of being a police informer and a member of the RSS. The crime was committed in furtherance of the organisation's conspiracy to spread terror among local villagers, and to threaten them against sharing any information regarding Naxal activities and movements with the security forces.

**Man held at Srinagar Airport with fake ticket; FIR registered**

Srinagar: J&K Police have registered a case against a person who attempted to enter Srinagar International Airport using a forged air ticket, officials said on Saturday. Police said that during routine security checks at the airport's drop gate, a person identified as Syed Khurshid Ahmad, a resident of Bugro, Khansahib, Budgam, was stopped for verification. "Upon checking his air ticket, it was found to be fake. Airline staff immediately alerted the authorities after identifying the ticket as fraudulent," police said. The accused was handed over to Police Post Humhama of Budgam Police and was subsequently arrested. Preliminary investigation revealed that the accused had been duped by a travel agent who allegedly forged the ticket.

**Dense fog affects visibility, 138 flights cancelled at Delhi airport**

New Delhi: As dense fog covered the national capital and several northern cities on Saturday morning, the reduced visibility resulted in cancellations of at least 138 flights at Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport. The Centre government has issued clear instructions to air carriers to inform passengers concerned about the actual status of the flights. The government has also asked the airlines to ensure the comfort of the passengers in case of flight delays. Around 69 arrivals and 69 departures were cancelled for the day, according to information available so far.

**Sonia condemns 'attack' on MGNREGA, pledges Congress support**

Congress Parliamentary Party Chairperson Sonia Gandhi Saturday strongly criticized the government's decision to scrap the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), calling it an "attack" on the rights of rural poor.



In a video message, Gandhi recalled the Congress-led UPA government's unanimous passage of MGNREGA in 2005, saying it had provided a lifeline to millions of rural families. "Modi government has bulldozed MGNREGA, removing Mahatma Gandhi's name and altering its framework without consultation," Gandhi said.

She alleged the government was ignoring the interests of farmers, labourers, and marginalised communities. Gandhi pledged Congress's support to the struggle against the

government's move, saying, "We will fight this black law."

The MGNREGA has been a crucial safety net for rural India, providing guaranteed employment and empowering gram panchayats. Gandhi's remarks come amid widespread protests against the government's decision to replace MGNREGA with the Viksit Bharat G RAM G Bill.

**Modi highlights Shivraj Singh's vision behind Viksit Bharat G RAM G Bill**

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi Saturday highlighted a write-up by union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, explaining how the Viksit Bharat G RAM G Bill seeks to revolutionise rural employment and livelihoods.

The bill, which replaces the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), guarantees 125 days of wage employment per rural household annually, up from the current 100 days.

Minister Chouhan emphasised that the bill is not a retreat from social protection, but rather its renewal. He stated, "the bill aims to transform rural livelihoods by enhancing employment guarantee, embedding local planning, balancing worker security with farm productivity, converging schemes, strengthening frontline capacity, and modernizing governance."

The Viksit Bharat G RAM G Bill focuses on creating durable rural assets, promoting transparency, and ensuring social audits. It also introduces a new cost-sharing formula, with the Centre and states sharing expenses in a 60:40 ratio for most states, and 90:10 for North-Eastern and Himalayan states.

**Muslim women burn effigy of Bangladeshi PM Yunus**

Angered by the lynching of a Hindu man in Bangladesh, Muslim women, under the joint auspices of Vishal Bharat Sansthan and Muslim Mahila Foundation, took out a protest march on Saturday from Subhash Bhavan in Lamhi town to Prem-

chand Smriti Dwar. In Bangladesh, a Hindu man was beaten to death by a mob on Thursday night in the name of religion, and his body was burned in Myensingh, a town in north-central Bangladesh.

Seven people have been arrested for the carnage by the interim government administration.

Following the march in Varanasi, an effigy of Bangladeshi chief advisor Mohammad Yunus was burned.

This protest march was organized to "boost the morale of the remaining Hindus in Bangladesh and to draw the world's attention to the open killings of Hindus."

**Budgam court issues NBW against Pak-based HM chief Salahuddin**

A Court in Budgam district of Jammu and Kashmir on Saturday issued a non-bailable warrant (NBW) against the chief of the banned terrorist outfit Hizbul Mujahideen, Mohammad Yousuf Shah alias Syed Salahuddin, in connection with a 2012 case.



certificates issued by the Station House Officer Budgam and the In-charge Police Post Soibugh confirmed that Salahuddin could not be traced and is presently residing across the border.

Special Judge designated under the National Investigation Agency Act in Budgam issued the warrant in FIR No. 331/2012 registered at Police Station Budgam under Sections 13, 18, 20 and 39 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) and Section 506 of the Ranbir Penal Code (RPC)

The court acted on an application moved by the Investigating Officer through the prosecution, stating that the accused had crossed over to Pakistan and is evading arrest. Police

After perusing the case diary, the Court observed that sufficient material exists on record to prima facie connect the accused with the alleged offences. The judge noted that the offences invoked are non-bailable in nature and fall under the UAPA, empowering the court to issue a warrant under Section 73 of the CrPC

The court has directed the Jammu and Kashmir Police to arrest the accused. It also noted that the original case diary (CD) has been sent to the competent authority for sanction, paving the way for filing of a charge sheet and trial in absentia, as per law.

**"I don't engage in politics to please anyone"**

Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah Saturday defended his remarks on the Centre, saying he has always maintained a consistent stand and does not engage in politics aimed at pleasing anyone.

Reacting to criticism over praising the central government, Omar said he openly acknowledges where the Centre has helped and does not hesitate to point out where it has failed, particularly on the issue of restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir.

"I say the same thing everywhere. I am not among those who play politics and deceive people. Where the central government has helped, I have said so. Where it has not helped, I have said that as well," Omar told reporters in Srinagar after

**Hyderabad builder held for duping investors of Rs 61cr**

New Delhi: The Enforcement Directorate's (ED) Hyderabad Zonal Office on Saturday arrested Kakarla Srinivas, the Managing Director of Jayathri Infrastructures India Pvt. Ltd.

The ED initiated its investigation based on multiple FIRs registered by the Hyderabad Police. The FIRs were filed against Jayathri Infrastructures India Pvt. Ltd., its Managing Director Kakarla Srinivas, Jayathri Reliabilities India Pvt. Ltd., and others under various sections of the IPC, 1860, and the Telangana State Protection of Depositors of Financial Establishments Act.

These FIRs stemmed from complaints by homebuyers and investors alleging cheating, criminal breach of trust, and misappropriation of funds. The victims were promised pre-launch flats, commercial units, metro-station stalls, and assured rental returns that never materialised. The ED investigation revealed that Kakarla Srinivas generated Proceeds of Crime (POC) totalling Rs 61 Crore by cheating homebuyers.

**Congress links SHANTI Bill to US pressure on Nuclear liability**

New Delhi: Congress leader Jairam Ramesh Saturday alleged that the government's push for the SHANTI Bill, which opens India's nuclear sector to private players, is linked to US pressure on nuclear liability rules. Ramesh pointed to a reference in the US National Defence Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2026, which mentions a joint assessment between the US and India on nuclear liability rules.

"The SHANTI Bill is actually the TRUMP Bill - The Reactor, Use and Management Promise Act," Ramesh wrote on X, suggesting the legislation is aimed at pleasing US President Donald Trump. Opposition parties have criticized the bill, arguing it compromises safety and benefits private companies, particularly in Small Modular Reactors. "This is a surrender to US pressure," said Ramesh, alleging the government is prioritizing foreign interests over national security and public safety.

**Veteran Malayalam actor-director Sreenivasan passes away**

Renowned Malayalam actor, screenwriter, director, and producer Sreenivasan passed away early Saturday at a private hospital in Thrupunithura near here following a prolonged illness. He was 69. His condition reportedly worsened while he was being taken for medical treatment. He breathed his last at the hospital. A towering presence in Malayalam cinema for nearly five decades, Sreenivasan was celebrated for his sharp wit, realistic storytelling, and incisive social satire.



Born on April 6, 1956, in Patyam near Thalassery, he entered the film industry in the late 1970s and went on to become one of Kerala's most influential cinematic voices. Over his illustrious career, Sreenivasan acted in more than 200 films and penned several landmark screenplays that blended humour with strong social commentary. Classics such as

Vadakkunokkiyanthram, Nadodikkattu, Sandesham, and Boeing-Boeing remain widely acclaimed for their satire, relatable characters, and insightful portrayal of society. As a writer, actor, and filmmaker, he played a pivotal role in shaping modern Malayalam cinema.

Beyond films, Sreenivasan was also known for his outspoken views on social issues and his advocacy of organic farming, earning admiration well beyond the film fraternity.

**Our Constitution has endured: Tharoor contrasts India with neighbours**

Politician and author Shashi Tharoor on Friday said that his book on the Constitution of India titled 'Our Living Constitution', aimed at making the country's foundational document accessible to ordinary citizens.



He pointed out that India's Constitution has demonstrated extraordinary resilience in a turbulent neighbourhood, enduring for more than seven decades, unlike those of its neighbours Pakistan and Bangladesh, which have been rewritten multiple times.

Speaking at the longest announcement of the 11th edition of the Oxford Bookstore Book Cover Prize, Tharoor drew a

sharp contrast between India's constitutional continuity and the repeated breakdowns witnessed in neighbouring Pakistan and Bangladesh.

"Look around the world and see how many constitutions have

lasted as long as ours," he said.

"Our neighbours, Pakistan and Bangladesh, have rewritten their constitutions multiple times. Pakistan was born at the same time as us, and Bangladesh after us, yet India has been able to keep its Constitution intact."

Tharoor strongly criticised the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), calling it "disgraceful" for introducing religion as a criterion for citizenship.

"For the first time, a religious provision was brought into the grounds of citizenship," he said. "Applying any religious test is violative not just of the spirit of the Constitution, but its letter as well."

**Air India Express grounds pilot for thrashing passenger**

Air India Express has grounded its pilot who thrashed and punched a passenger travelling with his family with toddler, leaving him with a black eye and bleeding face at Delhi Airport T1 on Friday.



The pilot, identified as Vijender Sejwal, reportedly attacked the passenger when the latter protested to his jumping the queue.

"The Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) has taken serious cognizance of the incident and directed the airline to ground the pilot with immediate effect. A formal enquiry has been ordered. Detailed reports have been sought from BCAS and CISF," Ministry said in its official handle.

Ankit Dewan and multiple authorities including Air India Express, Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA), the incident occurred when Dewan family were allowed to use staff channel for entry because their 4 month old baby.

Pics and clips circulating on social media showed a shocked Dewan wiping blood from his face and Sejwal looking over the him fallen on the floor, with at least three security personnel just stood watching.

The scuffle broke out when the pilot pushed his way forward by jumping the queue and Dewan apparently objected to it. Dewan was also alleged that the CISF staff prevented him to rush out after he was hit and get some medical aid while doing nothing themselves.

Responding to Dewan's post Air India Express said, "We profoundly regret this incident at Delhi Airport, involving one of our employees who was traveling as a passenger on another airline. We extend our heartfelt empathy for the distress it has caused, and strongly condemn such behaviour. The concerned employee has been removed from official duties with immediate effect, and appropriate action will be taken pending thorough investigation."
