

Bhopal Health Department on high alert for safe Holi and Rangpanchami



Bhopal: Bhopal's health administration has shifted into high gear to ensure a safe festive season, placing all government hospitals on a 24-hour emergency standby for Holi and Rangpanchami. Following

directives from CMHO Dr. Manish Sharma, medical facilities across the capital are prepared to handle the typical surge in festive-related cases, including chemical skin burns, eye irritations, respiratory

issues, and road accidents. To manage potential emergencies, every state-run hospital has reserved at least 10 beds exclusively for festive casualties. Specialized duty rosters have been implemented to ensure round-the-clock presence of trauma staff, while essential supplies like eye drops, anti-allergic medications, and burn kits have been restocked. Furthermore, 108 ambulance units have been strategically stationed in sensitive and high-traffic zones to minimize response times. Health officials are urging citizens to opt for natural colors and avoid toxic chemicals that cause long-term damage. The advisory specifically warns against rubbing eyes if stained and emphasizes staying away from intoxicants while driving. With these rigorous preemptive measures, the city aims to balance the vibrant spirit of the "Festival of Colors" with a robust safety net for every resident.

No E-tenders for 29 composite liquor shops worth Rs 521 crore in Bhopal; new strategy will be formulated

Bhopal: The district's 87 composite liquor stores have been divided into 20 groups. E-tenders were invited on Monday for 29 composite liquor stores in seven of these groups. The reserve price for these stores is Rs 521 crore, but no tenders have been received for these stores. In such a situation, now tenders will be taken for the new 31 shops of seven groups on March 5, while the tender process for the remaining 25 shops will be held on March 8. According to the information, out of the 87 composite liquor shops included in 20 groups of the district as per the provisions of the Excise Policy year 2026-27, e-tenders were sought for 29 composite liquor shops included in seven liquor groups randomly selected by the e-Excise portal to be executed in the first phase of Batch 1. On Monday, the execution process was carried out in the Collectorate meeting room, in which it was revealed that not a single tender has been received.



Now on March 5, the e-tender process will be held for 31 new composite liquor shops divided into seven groups. The reserve price for these shops has been fixed at around Rs 503 crore and the security deposit has been kept at Rs 5 crore 95 lakh. Tender process will be conducted for 31 shops in seven new groups. These include four shops in Piplani, five in Nehru Nagar, five in Sehore Naka, five in RS Market, four on Chhola Road, four in Alpana and four in Berasia. E-tenders were invited for 29 shops in seven groups, and the execution process began on Monday at the Collectorate. Not a single tender has been received for these. Tenders will now be issued for 31 shops in seven groups on March 5th and for 25 shops on March 8th. If no tenders are received, a new strategy will be formulated. HPV vaccination drive intensified in Bhopal

27,000 girls targeted under free immunization campaign

Bhopal: In the recent TL meeting, officials directed all government departments to actively spread awareness about the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine being administered to protect women from cervical cancer. The campaign aims to ensure maximum coverage among adolescent girls in the district. District Vaccination Officer Dr. Ritesh Rawat informed the meeting that the HPV vaccine is being provided free of cost at 18 government hospitals across Bhopal. Girls in the 14-15 age group are eligible for vaccination. Detailed guidance regarding registration on the UWIN portal was also shared with officials. Chief Executive Officer Ila Ti-




wari instructed the District Education Officer to prepare a listing of girls aged 14 to 15 studying in both government

and private schools. Schools have been directed to hold meetings to educate families about the benefits of vaccination. The Women and Child Development Department will administer vaccines through Anganwadi workers, while the Tribal Affairs Department will create awareness among girls residing in tribal hostels. Chief Medical and Health Officer Dr. Manish Sharma stated that around 27,000 girls in Bhopal are being covered under the campaign. As per the Collector's directives, all departments will coordinate to ensure widespread awareness and participation.

Bhopal DEO relieves C.J. Joyson amid fresh inquiry

Bhopal: In a decisive move toward administrative transparency, the District Education Officer of Bhopal has officially relieved Assistant Grade-03 C.J. Joyson from his current duties, effective immediately. The action follows a formal complaint lodged by the Physical Education Foundation of India (Bhopal Chapter) and complies with directives from the Joint Director of Public Instruction. Under the order issued on March 2, 2026, Joyson has been reassigned to the Government Maharani Laxmibai Girls Higher Secondary School, BHSL, pending the outcome of a fair and unbiased investigation. This is not the first time Joyson has faced administrative scrutiny; a similar inquiry in 2019 led to his temporary removal, though he was reinstated within a month.

Police recovers 1,835 stolen and lost mobile phones



By Special Correspondent Bhopal: In a special drive launched ahead of the festival of Holi, the Madhya Pradesh Police have recovered 1,835 lost and stolen mobile phones across various districts of the State over the past three weeks. The recovered devices, collectively valued at more than Rs 3 crore, have been returned to their rightful owners, reinforcing public confidence in the police. Acting with priority to safeguard citizens' property, the police utilised modern technological tools, cyber analysis, and the coordinated use of the CEIR and

NCRP portals. Special teams constituted at the police station level played a crucial role in tracing the devices, many of which were located in other States. Significant recoveries were reported from Gwalior (551 phones worth Rs 1.33 crore), Chhatrapur (200 phones), Ujjain (409 phones worth Rs 73.5 lakh), Singrauli (172 phones), Mandla (253 phones), and Guna (213 phones worth over Rs 50 lakh). In Katni and Jabalpur (GRP), arrests were made and stolen handsets seized from accused persons. In several districts, mobile distribution programmes were organised to mark Holi, bringing smiles to citizens. The initiative reflects the State police's commitment to sensitive and technology-driven policing while strengthening public trust and safety.

MP wheat procurement set to hit record 10 million metric tons

- State government ramps up prep for record wheat harvest
- Govt wheat prices likely to cross Rs 2,700 threshold for first time

By Kanhaiya Lodhi Bhopal: Madhya Pradesh is gearing up to challenge traditional agricultural giants like Punjab and Haryana this season, with official wheat procurement projected to cross the staggering mark of 10 million metric tons. Driven by a bumper harvest and lucrative pricing, the state government has already triggered large-scale preparations to manage the massive influx of grain. Historic prices and strategic stockpiling: For the first time, the payout to farmers could soar past the Rs 2,700 per quintal threshold. The Central Government has already set the Minimum Support Price (MSP) at Rs 2,585, a significant jump of ₹160 from last year. As the state celebrates 2026 as 'Kisan Kalyan Varsh' (Farmer Welfare Year), there is strong anticipation of an additional Rs 175 bonus. If approved, the effective price would reach Rs 2,760 per quintal, fulfilling the government's

cured 77.74 lakh metric tons, costing over ₹20,213 crore. This year's target reflects a planned increase of 2.5 million metric tons over the previous year. While the all-time high of 12.8 million metric tons was recorded during the 2021-22 COVID-19 era, the 2026 season is poised to be one of the most successful commercial procurement drives in the state's history. Surge in farmer participation: Registration trends suggest a major comeback in government procurement. After a dip to 15.44 lakh farmers last year, officials expect over 18 lakh farmers to sign up this season. Unlike previous years where many farmers held onto stocks for higher private market rates, the current bumper crop is expected to keep open-market prices stable, making the government's guaranteed MSP the most attractive and low-risk option. Closing the gap with previous records: Last season, MP pro-
