25 Women Bikers to Cover 1,400 km across Major Tourist Destinations of State
CM Dr. Yadav Flags off 'Queens on the Wheels' Women Bikers' Tour



Bhopal: The roar of high-performance engines filled the air at the Chief Minister's Residence on Saturday as Dr. Mohan Yadav flagged off "Queens on the Wheels 3.0." This ambitious seven-day expedition features 25 elite women superbikers from across India, set to traverse 1,400 kilometers to showcase Madhya Pradesh as a premier, safe, and vigilant destination for female travelers.

Biking across the 'Heart of India': Coinciding with International Women's Day celebrations, the tour serves as a moving testament to women's courage. The riders will journey through the state's most iconic her-

itage sites and wildlife sanctuaries, including the stupas of Sanchi, the erotic carvings of Khajuraho, the medieval charm of Orchha, and the wild expanses of Kuno National Park. "This isn't just a rally; it's a cam-

paign to show the world that Madhya Pradesh is not only 'Ajab-Gajab' but also a fortress of safety for women," Chief Minister Dr. Yadav remarked, emphasizing that the state government has coordinated with district-

level police to ensure seamless security and logistics for the group.

Age is just a number: The convoy is led by 62-year-old Dr. Neeta Khandekar from Mumbai, a veteran rider who famously completed a 21,000-km journey in 75 days. The group represents a true pan-India spirit, with riders hailing from Kolkata, Bengaluru, Nagpur, Noida, and Pune, alongside eight local bikers from Bhopal. Trina, a rider from West Bengal, shared her experience of riding through four states to reach Bhopal, noting that she felt the most secure upon entering Madhya Pradesh's borders.

Promoting cultural wealth: From the bravery of Bundelkhand to the natural beauty of Mahakaushal, the riders will act as brand ambassadors for the state's spiritual and natural tourism. The expedition is scheduled to conclude back in the capital on March 13, weaving together the vibrant colors of Rang Panchami with the spirit of female independence.

CM reprimands BJP MLA for warning of agitation against road widening

Bhopal: BJP MLA Anil Jain, representing the Ujjain North Assembly constituency, has been reprimanded for opposing road widening in Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh. In fact, the public had expressed support for the road widening and threatened to launch a movement. The matter had reached the attention of the Chief Minister and the organization's leaders.

After the matter came to light, MLA Anil Jain was summoned to the Chief Minister's House. He was severely reprimanded in the House in front of Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav, State President Hemant Khandelwal, and the State in-charge. Following the reprimand, he has suspended his protest. He will no longer oppose the road widening.

Indore-Ujjain Greenfield Project a 'Model of Trust' for farmers: CM

Bhopal: The proposed Indore-Ujjain Greenfield road is set to become more than just a high-speed corridor; it is being hailed as a "Model of Trust" between the state and its agrarian heartland. During a celebratory gathering at the Chief Minister's Residence, residents of the Sanwer region honored Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav for approving the project with a farmer-first approach, ensuring fair compensation and minimal disruption.

Built at an estimated cost of ₹3,000 crore, the expressway will revolutionize regional connectivity, slashing travel time between Indore and Ujjain from 75 minutes to a mere 30 minutes. Chief Minister Dr. Yadav emphasized that this project heralds a new era of prosperity, benefiting 20 villages in Indore and six in Ujjain. Beyond daily commuting, the road is strategically vital for the upcoming Simhastha Kumbh, local logistics parks, and providing farmers smoother access to major mandis.

A significant highlight of the project is the allocation of Rs 816 crore specifically for farmer compensation, a move Water Resources Minister Tul-

MP creates history in digital registration: CM Dr. Mohan Yadav

Bhopal: In a landmark move that redefines e-governance in India, Madhya Pradesh has officially transitioned to a completely paperless document registration system. Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav announced the historic roll-out of Sampada 2.0, integrated with a state-of-the-art Cyber Registration Office, making Madhya Pradesh the first state to offer a truly "anywhere, anytime" faceless registration experience.

The dawn of faceless governance: The heart of this revolution lies in the newly established

Cyber Registration Office in Bhopal. Citizens can now register nearly 75 different types of documents—including leases, mortgages, and power of attorney—without ever stepping into a Sub-Registrar's office. The system utilizes Aadhaar-based video KYC for identity verification, allowing parties to execute and present documents digitally before a Cyber Sub-Registrar from the comfort of their homes.

Transparency meets technology: Sampada 2.0 isn't just about speed; it's about security. The platform integrates seamlessly with land

records and urban administration databases. Key features include:

Geo-tagging: Properties are now digitally tagged to eliminate boundary disputes.

Automatic Mutation: Agricultural land transfers are now linked with "Cyber Tehsils" for instant, automatic records updates.

Revenue Milestone: With over 16 lakh documents registered annually, the department contributes over Rs 11,000 crore to the state exchequer, a figure expected to rise with these streamlined efficiencies.

Simplifying the citizen experience: By removing physical barriers, the government has empowered citizens to add names of family members to property titles or manage de-mortgages with just a few clicks.

"This technology-driven shift ensures that administrative processes are no longer a hurdle but a service," stated CM Dr. Yadav. By setting this national benchmark, Madhya Pradesh has transformed a traditionally cumbersome process into a transparent, reliable, and user-friendly digital journey.
