Cows being slaughtered under government protection, says Cong
Bhopal's Slaughter house beef case



Bhopal: The Bhopal Municipal Corporation slaughterhouse beef scandal has sparked a political firestorm again. Bhanu Hindu, president of the Jai Bhavani Hindu Organization, the complainant and exposer in the case, has issued a significant statement, stating that the matter has been characterized by negligence and cover-ups from the very beginning.

Regarding the matter, former Congress minister PC Sharma said, "Since day one, there have been unsuccessful attempts to suppress the case. Many prominent leaders are involved in this matter. Cows are being slaughtered under government protection. Congress even raised the issue in the House. The government has no answer. Now, a conspiracy is being hatched to prove the culprits innocent."

The case could be weakened by the lack of the Hyderabad lab's test report. The SIT has included the Mathura chemical test report in the charge sheet presented in court. The chemical test report raises doubts. The Hyderabad DNA test report is necessary to confirm beef. Sources indicate that the DNA test could not be conducted because the meat sample was spoiled. Now, the accused can challenge the Mathura test report in court.

SIT confirms beef in Bhopal container

500 pages charge sheet filed

Bhopal: The Special Investigation Team (SIT) probing the seizure of a massive consignment from the Municipal Corporation's slaughterhouse has officially confirmed the presence of beef. On Saturday, investigators submitted a comprehensive 500-page charge sheet in court, exactly 56 days after the arrest of the primary accused.

Laboratory tests from Mathura validated the SIT's findings, though reports from a Hyderabad facility are still awaited. Currently, slaughterhouse operator Aslam Qureshi and driver Shoaib remain in custody. However, the investigation has sparked backlash from Hindu outfits. Chandrashekar Tiwari, President of Sanskriti Bachao Manch, criticized the SIT for limiting the probe to just two individuals, demanding a deeper inquiry into the wider syndicate.

While Police Commissioner Sanjay Kumar confirmed that the legal proceedings have commenced, he maintained that the broader investigation remains active.

Call records expose murder plot in Morena

Morena: A suspected suicide case in Morena district has turned into a murder mystery after police uncovered crucial evidence through call detail records. According to police sources, Lavkush Mahor was found dead after being shot while sleeping at his home in the Singhonia police station area on the night of March 2-3.

Congress stages protest over rising LPG prices

Bhopal: The Bhopal City District Congress Committee on Saturday staged a unique protest at Roshanpura Square against the continuous rise in domestic and commercial LPG cylinder prices and growing inflation. The demonstration was led by district Congress committee president Praveen Saxena and witnessed participation from a large number of party workers, including women activists.

During the protest, Congress workers symbolically conferred the title of "doctor" on the Prime Minister, alleging that the Union government was administering repeated "doses of inflation" to the public. Protesters carried posters and placards reading "Injection of Inflation" and raised slogans against the Centre.

Women participants said the kitchen forms the starting point of every household and the steady rise



in LPG prices had severely disturbed family budgets. They noted that cooking gas is a basic necessity, and its increasing cost has placed an additional financial burden on homemakers and middle-class families. Saxena claimed that the price of a domestic LPG cylinder had risen

from around Rs 400 in 2014 to nearly Rs 920 at present. He also criticised the recent hike of about Rs 60 in domestic cylinders and around Rs 115 in commercial cylinders, warning that the party would intensify its agitation if prices were not reduced.

Health services in MP could deteriorate! Junior doctors' agitation intensifies

Wear black bands to protest against stipend blockages and announcing a Justice March



Bhopal: The agitation of junior doctors (resident doctors) studying and working in government medical colleges in Madhya Pradesh has intensified. They have worn black bands and started working to protest the delay in stipend increases and pending payments. The Junior Doctors Association (JUDA) has warned that they will boycott non-emergency services starting Monday, potentially impacting the state's healthcare system.

According to JUDA, the Madhya Pradesh government's order of June 7, 2021, mandated that CPE (Cost Price Escalation or equivalent)-based stipend increases and pending arrears be paid effective April 1, 2025. Doctors say this is not only a financial problem but also impacting their mental and professional morale.

Junior doctors will remain on duty today wearing black bands on various medical college campuses across the state. On Sunday, they will hold a "Justice March," a peaceful demonstration to press their demands. JUDA leaders clarified that the movement is entirely peaceful and its sole purpose is to draw the government's attention to their pending demands. They have adopted a phased protest strategy: first wearing black bands, then marching, and if their demands are not met, boycotting non-emergency services (OPD, routine checkups, etc.). Emergency services will continue.

Junior doctors have held similar protests in the past few months, but the stipend revision remains stalled. While there has been no official statement from the Health Department and Medical Education Department, doctors are demanding that an order be issued soon and the arrears be paid.
